ELECTION RESULTS— MOST OF THEM ANYWAY

Regardless of your opinion of the Presidential race, the election locally was an overall benefit to the Association and the City.

First and foremost, Measure F, the measure to replace 2012's disastrous Measure B was overwhelmingly approved by 61% of voters. For the first time in a while in San Jose, warring sides set aside their differences and worked together. Your Association was joined by the SJPOA, Local 230, the South Bay Labor Council, Mayor Sam Liccardo, almost the entire City Council and the Chamber of Commerce in passing Measure F. Even former Mayor Chuck Reed and the Mercury News were on our side. Now, San Jose has a true opportunity to move forward.



In Council races, we were able to successfully elect Sergio Jimenez in District 2, who won convincingly with 54.9% of the vote. Sergio will replace Association ally Ash Kalra, who won his race for State Assembly, handily beating former San Jose Councilmember and Measure B supporter Madison Nguyen.

Our candidate in District 6, Helen Chapman did not prevail, so Dev Davis will replace outgoing Councilmember Pierluigi Oliverio. While our candidate did not win, the battle was to replace a candidate that had repeatedly voted to slash pension benefits. He also was the sole councilmember to not support Measure F. Councilmember-elect Davis did support Measure F. We hope this is an indication of her willingness to keep an open mind on policy issues.

Finally, in a race where we did not make an endorsement, but our allies in the POA, Local 230 and the Labor Council did in District 8. Incumbent Rose Herrera is termed out. Our allies endorsed schoolboard member Sylvia Arenas against former District 8 candidate Jimmy Nguyen. Right now, the race is too close to call as ballots continue to be counted. Out of 34,220 votes counted so far, Arenas leads Nguyen by 88 votes. We will have to stay tuned on this one.

As 2017 begins, we will seek to meet with the new councilmembers and build what we hope are strong productive working relationships.
