REMAINING IN AN ACADEMY FOR THE 2018-19 SCHOOL YEAR

Before winter break, all Academy students were asked to indicate if they want to remain in their Academy for the 2018-19 school year by signing an Intent to Return roster. If the student checked "Yes," than that student will be automatically re-enrolled in the Academy for 2018-19. If an Academy student indicated that he/she does not want to continue in the Academy next year, a form will be sent home for the student and a parent to sign, confirming that the student would like to be removed from the Academy next year. That form will be distributed to students at the end of the month, should be signed and returned to Mrs. Combs.

In regards to Out of Zone students, district policy states that Out of Zone Academy students no longer have to fill out an Out of Zone Waiver each year. Simply being on an Academy roster acts as the student's Out of Zone waiver.

ACADEMY APPLICATION WINDOW OPENS JAN. 18TH FOR STUDENTS WHO WOULD LIKE TO JOIN AN ACADEMY

Current 8th and 9th grade students are invited to apply to Academy programs during the application window: January 18th – February 8th. If there is a 9th grader not involved in an Academy this year, or if a current 9th grade Academy student wants to leave their 2017-18 Academy to take part in a different Academy at Nease, or at any high school in St. Johns County, for the 2018-19 school year, they will need to apply during the application window. This year applications will be submitted through the Student's Home Access Center account. Students are allowed to apply to up to three Academies, ranked in order of preference. WOMEN IN I.T. ONE-WEEK SUMMER INTERNSHIPS



For the 5th year, Citi is offering a one-week paid internship focusing on technology and robotics for up to 18 girls. The purpose of the internship is to encourage girls to consider careers in Information Technology such as Programming, Project Management, Program Testing, Information Security, etc. Girls will have to be age 16 or older by June 1, 2018 in order to participate. The internship is Mon. – Fri., June 11 – 15, 2018 from 8:30 am – 5:00 pm and the salary is \$12 per hour. Those accepted must be available all 40 hours and are responsible for their own transportation to and from the Citi campus. Citi is located near Baptist South Hospital on the St.

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ACADEMY PROBATION POLICY

A reminder that Academy students sign a contract at the beginning of each year stating that they will maintain certain academic and behavioral standards in order to remain in an Academy program. Academy students must maintain a total GPA of at least a 2.0, and must maintain at least a 2.5 GPA (75%) in an Academy class. A student in an Academy must also maintain a good discipline record.

In accordance with district policy, if a student does not meet these requirements, he/she will be placed on probation for a semester. If, at the end of that probation period, he/she does not have a GPA which meets the requirements, or fails to have an improved discipline record, the student will be removed from the Academy. If an Out of Zone student is removed from an Academy, he/she will be transferred back to his/her zoned school.

Letters will be sent home after report card grades are released, to make students and parents aware of probationary status for the remainder of the 2017-2018 school year.
