As one of the costume designers for theatrical performances at a local high school, I typically outfit a cast of many different shapes and sizes. The overall process is straightforward: determine what costumes are needed, find the fabric, and create each piece. Taking into consideration the time period, the setting, and every character, we begin by choosing fabrics, either altering existing, good quality garments or starting from scratch to create a brand-new piece. Things get more complicated as we begin matching costume to cast member, taking a garment in or letting it out, sewing additional material here or there, and adding embellishments to spice it up. To bring a costume to life, we often bedazzle it with sequins, fringe, or other notions.

This experience often leaves me pondering about the similarities between a show and real life. Each of us has a unique set of spiritual gifts, threads which make up the fabric of who we are. It's important to periodically take inventory, reflect on what threads may be crisscrossing, what adjustments need to be made, and how we might further develop our gifts and discover new ones to enhance our lives.
