Gratitudes, Joys and Sorrows

Rev. Robert N. West, Senior Minister here at our church from 1963 to 1969, died this past September; he was 88 years old. Rev. West's ministry here included the chartering of two buses that took 150 people to march with Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in Selma, Alabama in 1965. The 1968 addition to our current building (also designed by the architect Louis Kahn) was begun and completed during West's ministry. Rev. West left our church to become President of the Unitarian Universalist Association. He was a remarkable leader for our national association of congregations.
