****Defying the Nazis: The Sharp's War***

In 1939, a Unitarian minister and his wife, Waitstill and Martha Sharp, went to Europe to try to help refugees fleeing the Nazis. During the next few years, they and other Unitarians who followed them helped refugees find sanctuary and brought many children to safety in the United States. Their story has been told in a film by Ken Burns and Artemis Joukowsky (the Sharp's grandson) that aired on PBS last fall.
