Here is some information to help you fully participate in worship:

- ♦ * indicates that those who are willing and able are invited to stand.
- ♦ Hymns are sung from the hymnals located under the seats in the pews.
- ♦ We strive to make worship accessible to all people. There is a Braille hymnal and large print bulletins available from the ushers. There are listening devices for those who have hearing loss, and if you have a T-coil hearing aid, you can connect directly to our sound system through the hearing loop system.
- ♦ If you would like to learn more about Edgewood, fill out the yellow card in your pew and turn it in during the “Gathering of Gifts and Tithes.”
- ♦ You are invited to wear a nametag, and probably received one already! To get a permanent nametag, take your sticky tag and put it on the red banner on the nametag table. Your new nametag will be waiting there for you next Sunday.

Edgewood is a vibrant, safe community for all ages. Children and youth are welcome to remain in worship with their family or attend church school. There are activity bags available as you enter the sanctuary.

Church School and Child Care Schedule:

- ♦ Church School for grades K-12 each Sunday after “Children’s Worship.” Classrooms are in the East Wing. You can accompany your child to class, if you like, and then return to worship.
- ♦ Childcare for infants through preschool is provided for the whole service, also in the East Wing. There is a paging system for parents to stay connected.
- ♦ “After Care” for young children is available every Sunday after worship until noon in the Elementary Room in the East Wing. Parents need to sign their children in and out.

His work with the Michigan Conference is in providing associations, churches, clergy and laity with an extensive support system, while challenging them to a deeper vision of Christian ministry; strengthening them in their efforts to be faithful in mission; and linking them to the wider church and to each other.

Campbell and his spouse, Eileen, a regional sales representative and quilter, reside in Haslett, Michigan and are the parents of two grown sons, Samuel, a university chaplain in Worcester, Massachusetts; and Nathan, a lawyer in Washington, DC.

I had the pleasure of meeting Dr. Keith Hampton at last summer’s UCC Musicians’ Association conference, and in the course of our conversation learned that he once served as a Teaching Assistant at Northwestern University to former Edgewood Director of Music Dr. Robert Harris. Dr. Hampton is an organ performer, conductor, composer, educator, church musician, adjudicator, and workshop clinician, and is the Founder and Artistic Director of the Chicago Community Chorus (CCC). He is currently serving both as Director of Music/Organist at St. Thomas Episcopal Church and as Assistant Director of Music at Trinity United Church of Christ, both in Chicago. Classically trained as an organist and conductor, and a specialist in the field of Gospel Music, Dr. Hampton was selected in 2010 by the North Central American Choral Directors Association as one of the top 25 Contemporary Composers, "whose composition, *Praise His Holy Name*, should be standard repertoire for choirs today and for the next 25 years." Since we didn’t have that piece in the Edgewood choir library, I thought it was time we get on board and sing it!! - Monty

SCRIPTURE

John 17:6-21

I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word.
