The living history portrayal session will be presented by George W. Cobb, D.D. Dr. Cobb is a retired United Methodist minister whose hobby is Living History. In addition to chairing the Commission on Archives & History in the North Alabama Conference, he is a member of the SEJ Commission and serves two rural churches. Since retirement in 2004, he and his wife Betty have shared Living History presentations with more than 100,000 school children. He has done Historic Portrayals of several 18th century ministers in six Southeastern states.
