What Your Child Learned Today

Today your child learned of Wisdom's invitation to grow in God's wisdom. Your child heard the dire warnings against foolishness and learned that God loves us and wants us to grow in wisdom. Try This

Our memory verse says, "Wisdom calls out." As a family, come up with ten or twenty bits of wisdom—everything from washing hands to praying before bed. Or choose ideas from Proverbs. Then, take turns standing on a chair or high place and calling them out!

Living in Wisdom: Wisdom's Invitation

- Scripture: Proverbs 1:20–33
- Big Idea: God gives us wisdom. He tells us that we have a choice to make. We can choose the way of life and peace or the way of death and destruction.
- Memory Verse: "Out in the open wisdom calls out." Proverbs 1:20

SOMETHING ELSE TO DO

One of the best ways to grow in godly wisdom is by reading the Bible. Start by reading a chapter or two from the book of Proverbs. (You can also read one chapter a day for a month, as there are 31 chapters.) Although the author of most of Proverbs was very wise, still wiser was Jesus himself. So, why not read some of Jesus's words together! A great place to start is the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5–7. Begin by reading the Beatitudes (Matthew 5:1–12), which flip common beliefs on their heads. Discuss what Jesus meant and how we can be more like him.
