Law Students in Boston Gather for 'Historic Event'

BOSTON--More than a dozen students gathered in a mock courtroom at **Suffolk University Law School in Boston** to watch Thursday's Senate hearing. While Christine Blasey Ford fielded questions, law students said they were witnessing an event they believe will be talked about for decades to come.

"I definitely think that this is a historic event, and that's mostly why I'm here," said Andrea Ramirez, a third-year law student from Hudson, Mass.

Ms. Ramirez, a 24-year-old who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, said she found Dr. Ford to be relatable and vulnerable during her testimony. She faulted the GOP-controlled Senate Judiciary Committee for "this unwillingness to look at other evidence."

Douglas Bennett, a second-year student and former county commissioner from Nantucket, faulted Sen. Dianne Feinstein for not forwarding

a late July letter from Dr. Ford to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

“I think that she’s credible,” Mr. Bennett said of Dr. Ford, after she testified. “But I think if Kavanaugh does get through, I think it could be because the information was not disclosed earlier by Sen. Feinstein.”

Mr. Bennett, 42, said he voted for Barack Obama twice and President Trump in 2016. As for Mr. Kavanaugh, “up until these last couple days, I’ve been supporting him,” he said. “I think it’s important we’re having these hearings so we can hear both sides.”
