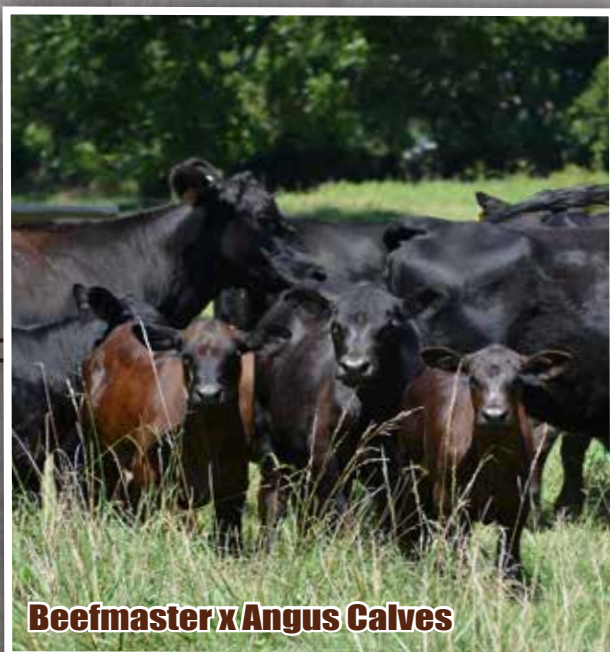

- Joshua Gaskamp, Noble Research Institute

JOSHUA GASKAMP serves as a wildlife and range consultant in the producer relations program. He joined the Noble Research Institute in 2007 after working as a hunting guide and gun-dog trainer on the King Ranch. His areas of interest include wildlife habitat improvement, range management, white-tailed deer management, fisheries management, plant identification, prescribed fire and feral hog impacts. Gaskamp's research on drop-nets as a potential tool for feral hog control led him to develop the BoarBuster™ suspended corral trap. Gaskamp grew up in Brenham, Texas.



JEFF TIBBITS is a Wildlife Biologist at ODWC administering the Oklahoma Land Access Program. Born in Oklahoma, he grew up on a ranch near Ardmore and received a B.S. degree in NREM-Wildlife Ecology and Management from Oklahoma State University. Prior to joining the ODWC in 2015, he surveyed and classified wetlands in the Ouachita Mountains of Oklahoma, surveyed birds in prairies and wetlands throughout the US, and conducted research in Texas to improve population estimates and survey protocols for a potentially imperiled wetland bird (Black Rail).

Expiring Resolutions

These two resolutions were tabled until the committee meetings at Convention during the Winter Policy meeting in January. OCA membership will address them during the Joint Committee meeting on Friday, July 21st at 4 pm.

BP 14.01.08 – Federal Reinsurance for Private Sector Catastrophic Livestock Risk Insurance

WHEREAS, US cattle are extremely susceptible to a host of diseases such as Foot and Mouth, BSE, foreign and emerging animal health diseases and others that could be released inadvertently or as an act of terrorism, and

WHEREAS, adequate state and federal funding of existing indemnity programs, in the event of widespread catastrophic occurrences, is uncertain and unrealistic to depend on, and

WHEREAS, there is no readily available or affordable private sector or governmental financial capacity to fund response to catastrophic events, and

WHEREAS, in the absence of a comprehensive catastrophic livestock risk insurance for such catastrophic risks.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the OCA encourage the federal government to provide the same reinsurance and funding as provide to the FCIC (Federal Crop Insurance) Program.

BP 14.05.02 – Small Grain Producers Assistance

BE IT RESOLVED, that the OCA requests that the Secretary of Agriculture be directed to give small grain, haying, grazing and silage producers the same program benefits as given small grain producers through substitution, recourse loans and loan deficiency payments to allow livestock producers to establish equitable crop yields and bases.
