



International March of the Living Fellowship Program Seeking Nominations

The International March of the Living is proud to announce the inauguration of its March of the Living Faculty Fellowship Program, in collaboration with the George Washington University School of Education and Human Development.

The inaugural class of fellows is being recruited for the 2018-2019 cycle and will consist of five professors who teach at one of the over 1,800 institutes of higher learning that do not currently offer any Holocaust/genocide studies courses. Fellowships will be awarded to distinguished faculty members who along with their institutions, commit to offering a Holocaust/genocide course within a year of their completion of the program. The fellowship itself will consist of a six-month curriculum designed by a committee of prestigious Holocaust scholars and leading educators.

The first phase of the program will be completed via online interactions and videotaped lectures. The second phase of the program will include the fellows spending seven days in Washington D.C. followed by an educational mission to Poland which will provide context and a deeper understanding of the material. The third phase of the program will include online interactions and videotapes lectures. There will then be a concluding session with the goal of helping the fellows encapsulate the information they will have learned and to help them develop their syllabi. The fellowship is all-expenses paid and the fellows will receive a \$2,000 stipend upon completion of the program.
