Metal Clay is a relatively new product, consisting of microscopic particles of metal in a moist organic binder. It is pliable like clay and is then fired in a kiln to burn off the binder and fuse the particles into a solid piece of metal. Projects will be presented that allow a beginner to acquire the knowledge, skills and techniques necessary to work in metal clay. More advanced versions will be presented that need an extra level of skill, allowing intermediate and advanced metal clay students to experiment. Some project examples include hollow forms, made as simple 2-piece hollow forms for beginning students and complex multilevel hollow forms for intermediate and advanced students.
