This CSD/Waste Connections sponsored free event will take place at the Community Park. Cash donations will be accepted and used for our Community Supporting Youth Fund.

To prepare: remove everything from the tree including all ornaments, lights, ornament holders, nails and stand. Trees that are “flocked” are not eligible for chipping.

Discarded wreaths, garland, and greenery with metal, plastic, wire, lights, or ornamentation are not considered green waste. Place them in your trash cart.

- B) Utilizing Boy Scout curbside tree collection fundraiser offered on Saturday only

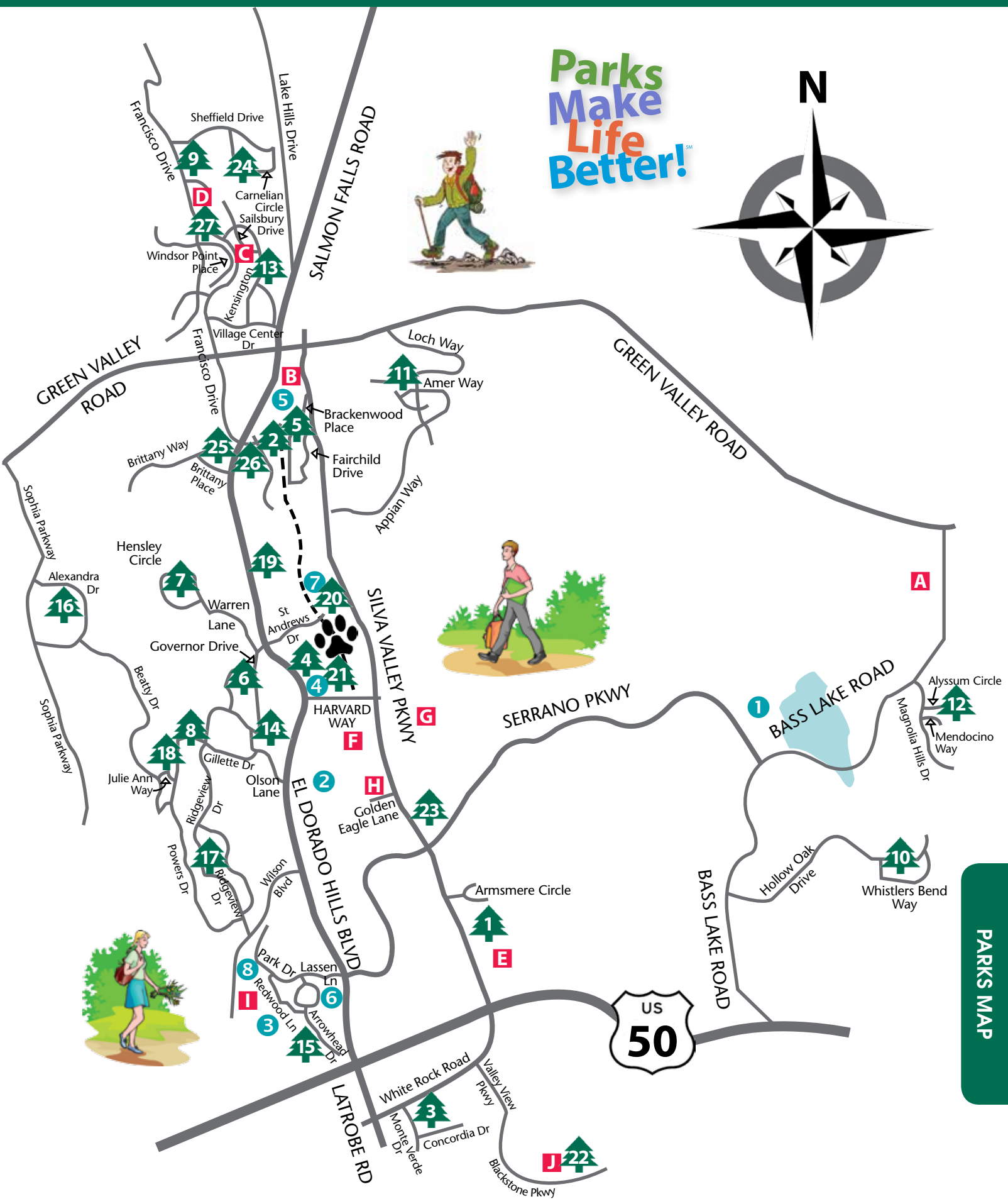
