ANNUAL TRIBAL LEADERS SUMMIT March 20-21, 2018

Average Attendance: 200

The Annual Tribal Leaders Summit is a two-day conversation on the status of violence against Native women and children in New Mexico. The event highlights tribal, state and federal perspectives and challenges that our tribal communities face across in addressing and responding to violence.

The summit includes a briefing on policy and legislative updates, field experts sharing best practices directly from our tribal communities and a current state of affairs in the movement to end violence.

Registration is free and lunch is provided on both days.



ANNUAL NATIVE YOUTH SUMMIT May 27-30, 2018

Average Attendance: 40 Native Youth from across the region

Sponsorships: \$1,500 to \$5,000

Benefits: Free event attendance, logo placement on event materials, website, social media and advertising information, and logo placement on each of the tables.

The Annual Native Youth Summit is a four-day, powerful leadership development experience that connects, challenges and cultivates a cohort of Native youth ages from 12 to 18 from across the region. This summit is designed to elevate Native youth into leadership roles that will transform their lives to transform their tribal communities.

Native youth face many challenges in today's world. CSVANW has carefully crafted a summit experience that builds a supportive and transformative network.

Summit attendance is free. Travel, lodging, meals and supplies are provided to all youth selected to attend.



ANNUAL #IWillRunForHer COMMUNITY 5k & 1k KIDS' RUN October 6, 2018

Average Attendance: 400 Runners and their families

Sponsorships: Starting at \$250 to \$1,000

Benefits: Logo placements on shirts, website, social media, and event course signage

October is National Domestic Violence Awareness Month. For many domestic violence survivors or others doing this work seeking self-care, running is healing and movement is medicine.

Four out of 5 of Native women are affected by violence, and of the four, 55% experience domestic violence. At this annual community event, we ask participants to dedicate their run to raise awareness on how they or their loved one(s) have been affected by domestic violence to honor the resilience, strength and spirit of our Native women.

Registration is free.

ANNUAL AWARDS GALA AND AUCTION October 20, 2018

Average Attendance: 200

Sponsorships: Start at \$1,000

Benefits: Free event attendance, logo placement on event materials, website, social media and advertising information, and logo placement on each of the tables.

The annual Awards Gala and Auction is CSVANW's signature event showcasing the unique and indispensable contributions of our region's Coalition champions who have made significant contributions in the movement to end violence against Native women and children.

Each year, CSVANW celebrates the exemplary individuals and recognizes the importance of their visionary leadership and highlights the achievements they have made not only within their community but to all tribal communities. The event includes an auction and dinner, with the auction a generator for the Coalition's non-discretionary funds.
