*CMCN Home Study*



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The *Home Study* course prepares you for the Certified Managed Care Nurse (CMCN) exam. The content of the course focuses on case, disease, quality and utilization management as well as preventative healthcare. The Home Study course is provided by AAMCN, which is *accredited* by the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Accreditation to provide continuing nursing credits.

### *RNs, LPNs, LCSWs, and LPCs*

can sit for the certification exam. Licensed social workers and counselors can take the exam and become Certified Managed Care Professionals (CMCP). There is no working experience required for exam eligibility, but you must have a current, valid license and have completed the Home Study course or submit an affidavit of your working and educational background to the American Board of Managed Care Nursing (ABMCN), which administers the exam. ### *The Certification Process*

Once you receive your Home Study course, you have 6 months to turn in your post-test and earn the 19 CNEs with a passing score of 70% or better. After passing the post-test, you then have another 4 months to sit for the CMCN exam.

*The exam* is comprised of 200 multiple choice questions and the fee is \$250. The exam can be proctored by your supervisor or someone from your human resources or education department. If those options are unavailable, you can ask your local librarian or public college testing center to proctor the exam. You can also take it at either of AAMCN's biannual conferences for an additional \$45 fee.

### *CMCN and CMCP Credentials*

After you successfully pass the CMCN exam with a score of 70% or better, you can begin to use the credentials CMCN (for nurses) or CMCP (for licensed social workers and counselors) after your name. To maintain this certification, you must earn 25 nursing CE's (the same ones you use to renew your state license) and pay \$55 every 3 years.

### *Group pricing:*

Groups of 3 or more can purchase the Home Study course and one year of membership for \$295 per order or \$195 without CDs.
