## ADOPT - DON'T SHOP!

A shelter pet is more than one in a million—she's one in 2.7 million. That's the number of adoptable dogs and cats who are still euthanized each year in the United States, simply because too many pets come into shelters and too few people adopt.

The number of euthanized animals could be reduced dramatically if more people adopted pets instead of buying them. When you adopt, you save your animal and open up shelter space for another animal who might need it. There are many organizations that have pets available for adoption in the Wichita area. These include the Kansas Humane Society, the Wichita Animal Shelter and there are many local rescues, all of which might have just who you are looking for!

**FACT:** The **Wichita Animal Shelter** and the **Kansas Humane Society** are separate entities and operate separately despite being located at the same address. It is a little known fact that **you can adopt an animal from the Wichita Animal Shelter THROUGH the Kansas Humane Society**. If you are looking to adopt be sure to visit both facilities!

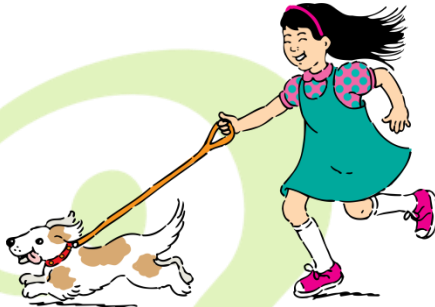

**DID YOU KNOW?** In the city of Wichita it is illegal to own more than 2 pit bull or pit bull mixes. Also, all adult pit bulls and mixes are required to be microchipped and spayed or neutered.

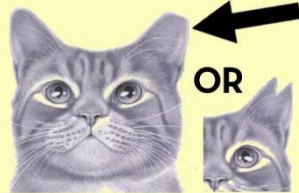


**DID YOU KNOW?** In the city of Wichita, all animals except cats must be confined by either a leash, rope, fenced area (conventional or electronic), or inside a dwelling 24 hours a day and not allowed to roam free without the benefit of one or more of these types of restraints.

**DID YOU KNOW?** All dogs over 5 months of age are required to be licensed in the city of Wichita annually and to be vaccinated for rabies. Dog owners can get discounts toward the license for having a fenced yard, and if the dog is spayed or neutered, and/or microchipped.

**DID YOU KNOW?** If you see a cat in your neighborhood with an ear tip, it is a sign that the cat has been caught, spayed or neutered, and released.

**DID YOU KNOW?** It is unlawful to keep a dog tethered in place for more than one hour at a time with a three hour break between, and for no more than a total of three hours per day.



**DID YOU KNOW?** If dogs are commonly running loose in your neighborhood and are thought to be a danger to the postal carrier, the USPS may stop delivering mail to the homes until the problem is resolved.
