




The City of Wichita celebrates Neighborhood Night Out 5:30- 9 p.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 8.

Neighborhood Night Out is an annual event that promotes public safety. It combats crime by encouraging neighbors to get to know one another through neighborhood parties, picnics, cookouts and other social gatherings over one designated evening. Formerly celebrated as National Night Out and Celebrate Safe Communities, Neighborhood Night Out is in its second year. Elected officials, police officers, firefighters and other City staff will attend neighborhood parties.

To encourage participation, the City will waive park fees for groups that want to hold their gathering in a neighborhood park. While supplies last, the City also will provide barricades at no charge to groups that want to block off a portion of the street for their event. The registration form for parties is available online, as well as the form for street closures.

- Click on the "Government" tab and then "Police;"
- Click on the "Forms" button for a drop down menu; and
- Click the last item on the drop down menu and fill out the Neighborhood Night Out registration form.





THE TREE IN THE CIRCLE Have you noticed the new tree at Bitting and 13th? The City Forestry Department and Arborist picked out the tree, planted it for us, and is watering it for three years. What a wonderful surprise! The Chinese Fringe Tree is a deciduous tree that is very slow growing. It can grow anywhere from 15 to 20 ft. high and 20 to 25 ft. wide. During the trees younger years its bark is pale in color and peels off in papery like strips. On the mature trees, the bark is tight, with distinct ridges and furrows. The leaves are oval shaped and can be three to eight inches long and one to four inches wide. When in bloom, from May to June, the Chinese Fringe Tree produces white flowers, that can give off a slight fragrance.
