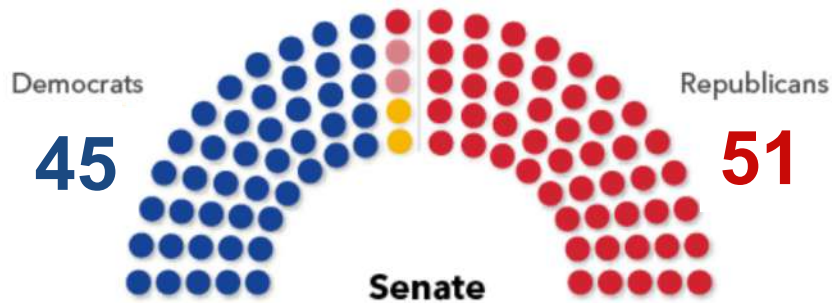


# 2018 Midterm Election Results

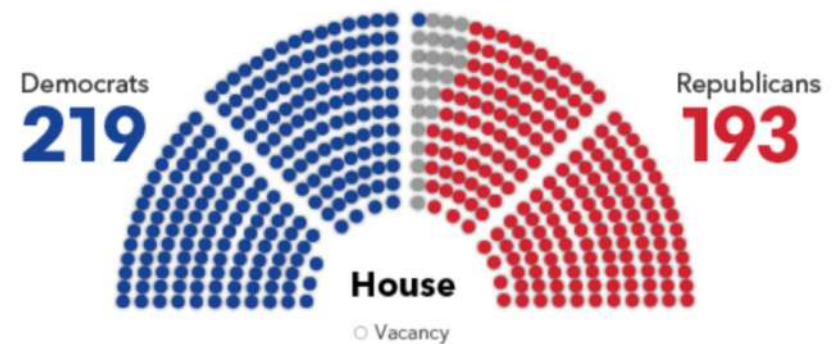
as of November 7, 12:00 pm

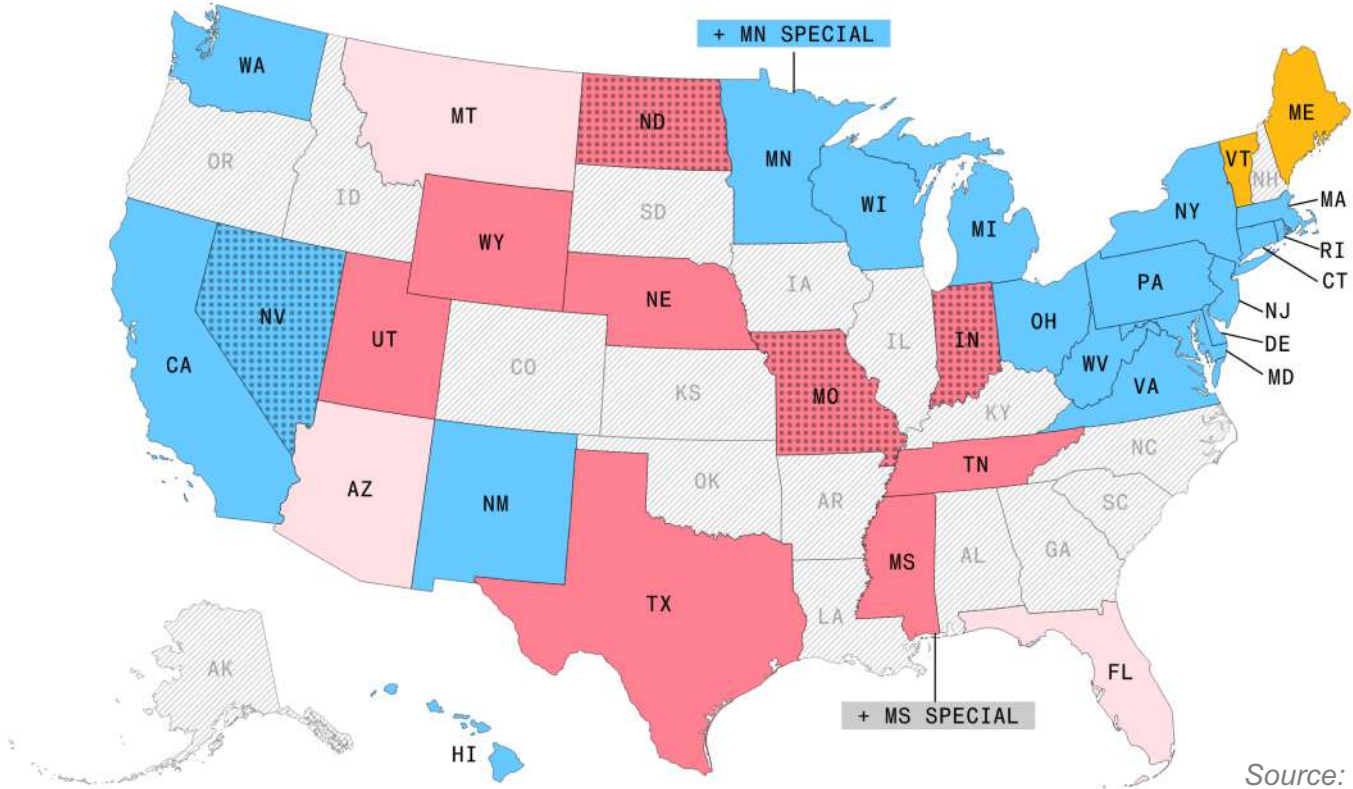

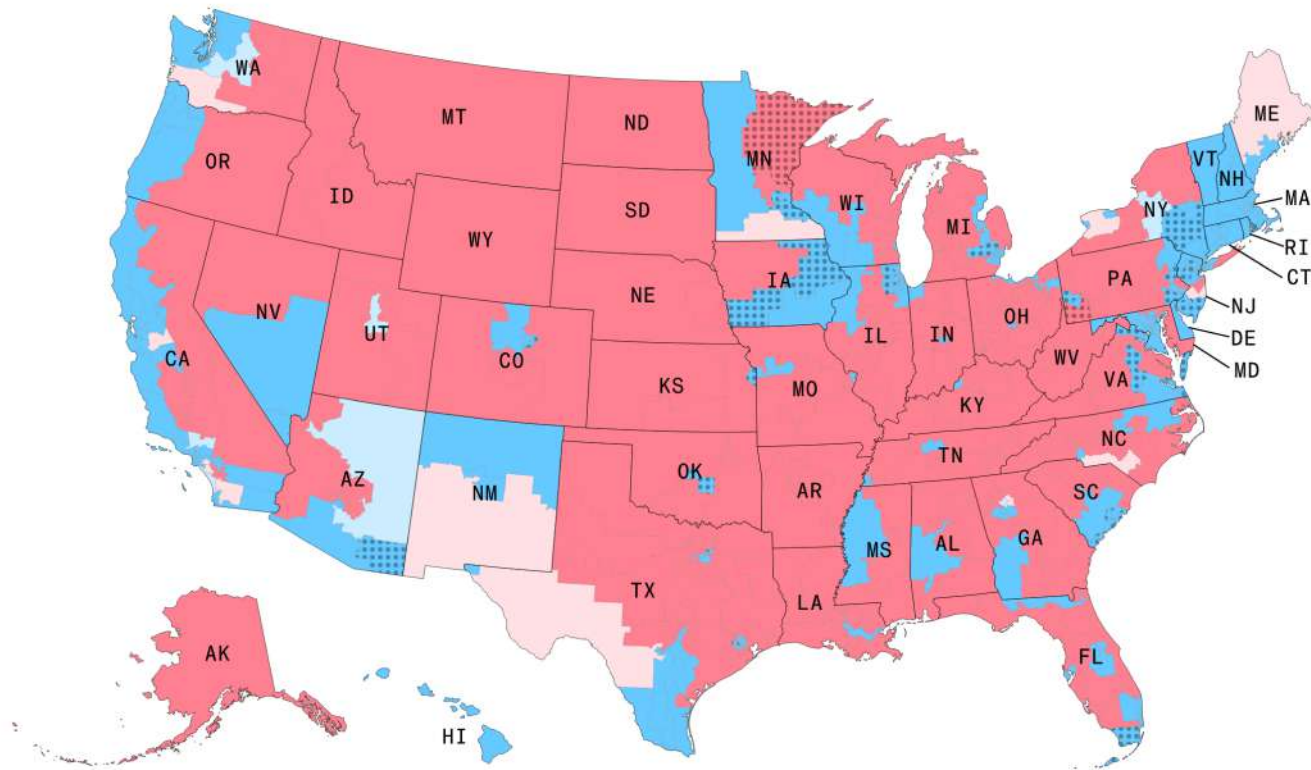

**JEFF VAN DREW (D-NJ-01)**

**Election:** Defeated Seth Grossman to succeed Rep. LoBiondo (R)

**Residence:** Cape May Court House

**Born:** Feb. 23, 1953

**Family:** Wife, Ricarda; 2 children

**Health Care Positions:**

- Favors reforming, not repealing, the ACA
- Believes costs are the root problem of health care access
- Supports incentivizing small businesses to offer health insurance
- Supports limiting medical malpractice awards
- Opposes Medicare cuts or privatization



**TOM MALINOWSKI (D-NJ-07)**

**Election:** Defeated incumbent Rep. Lance (R)

**Residence:** Rocky Hill

**Born:** Sep. 23, 1965

**Family:** 1 child

**Health Care Positions:**

- Supports reinstating individual mandate
- Supports allowing Medicare to negotiate Part D drug prices
- Supports Medicare buy-in option for all Americans



**MIKIE SHERRILL (D-NJ-11)**

**Election:** Defeated Jay Webber to succeed Rep. Frelinghuysen (R)

**Residence:** Montclair

**Born:** Jan. 19, 1972

**Family:** Husband, Jason; 4 children

**Health Care Positions:**

- Supports stabilizing ACA Marketplace and guaranteeing subsidies for low-income Americans
- Supports allowing Medicare to negotiate Part D drug prices
- Supports Medicare buy-in for individuals aged 55-64
