Description of Event Components

Downtown Streets Team Cultural Competency Workshop – December 10, 2018

Taking a closer look at local data, common misperceptions, and complete with Downtown Streets Team "Myth Smashers Game", this hour-long seminar debunks the myths associated with homelessness and pairs the lesson with an interactive Jeopardy-style game. Great for groups of any size, and seamlessly paired with team building activities like donation assembly days and lunch and learns.

The Blue Tarp Project - December 10 & 11, 2018

The Blue Tarp Project is comprised of two components. The first is a display of 50 portraits of homeless volunteers. Each volunteer has signed their name to their portrait. Some have written messages about what it is like to be homeless to raise awareness and tell their story. The second component is our informational posters on homelessness. These posters educate communities about the untold truths of being homeless, and correct misconceptions that make understanding and kindness more difficult.

Destination: Home Housing Ready Presentation – December 11, 2018

Housing Ready Communities is a Destination: Home initiative that brings together neighbors, community groups, government, and housing developers to take action and support approval and development of new supportive housing and extremely low income affordable housing throughout Santa Clara County.
