




# The ELKS Call

I am excited to be back from the 2018 Elks National Convention held in San Antonio, Texas, July 1st through the 4th. The meetings and trade show allowed me to gain a lot of very useful information and Suzanne and I had a great time seeing our fellow Alabama Elks and meeting other Elks from across the country. I have left several copies of each day's events at the Lodge. Please feel free to read each one. They are very informational.

There are three topics I would like to share with you that we learned while in San Antonio. First, The Elks National Foundation informed us that they would again be providing the Anniversary Grant to all lodges that apply. This is another \$1,500.00 that Di and her "Think Tank" will be able to use. Please see Di Wilson to get involved in these great programs. Second, Totals from the Annual Charity Reports show that all lodges combined to donate an all-time high of \$675,985,245 in time, mileage and in-kind gifts. That is a lot of time and money. Third, The Elks National Drug Awareness Program continues to grow. One program that keeps getting bigger and bigger is The National Prescription Drug Take Back Day. This is a great time to clean out that medicine cabinet from prescription medicines not being used or that are expired. The next DEA Take Back Day is October 27 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. You can visit DEA.gov to find a disposal site in your area or check with your local pharmacist.

We again had our annual Drug Awareness Day at the Harvest Youth Club. The kids were treated to hamburgers and hot dogs, given tours of a Huntsville City Fire Engine and Madison County SWAT response vehicle. The Sheriff's Department also had several educational programs they presented to the children. Once the programs were over, the rest of the afternoon was spent enjoying water sports, two big water slides and a bouncy bounce. It was a very nice outing and enjoyed by all that attended.

Again, and again and again I must stress membership growth. Football season is fast approaching, and the dog days of summer will be over. This is great time to bring potential guest to the lodge. We have a great area with lots of TV's for all the games and our patio is as good as any in town. We will soon place a reserved parking place near the entrance for each "Recruiter of the Month".

**ENF INFORMATION**, we have a new chairman for our ENF (Elks National Foundation) program. Col. Tom Hartley will be helping our Lodge with this very important program. Our grant monies come from the ENF. If we could get more members to participate in this worthy program, we could get an extra \$500 in grant money. The "mission" of the ENF is to build stronger communities! This past year the State of Alabama Elks donated \$53,334.84 and the ENF gave back, \$96,240.00 for State Charities, State Special Projects, Most Valuable Student, Legacy Award, and National Veterans Service Commission, and through the Community Investment Program (CIP) a total of \$125,000 was awarded to 20 Lodges in Alabama (we were one of the 20).

The GL did a slide show presentation of Lodge activities and our Huntsville Lodge was the ONLY Lodge in Alabama represented in the slide show! **GRANTS:** We just finished our "**Gratitude Grant**" with the Harvest Youth Club and our Drug Awareness program. The field day, complete with water sides and a bouncy house was enjoyed by all the children. Thanks to Chad Gilreath (Waffle House) for donating the hamburgers, hot dogs, buns, Seth Lund for the cookies, our grill masters Matthew Bradford and Matthew Danner, ER Byrom and Suzanne, Jan Abbott, Cathy Kulas, Bob Gamble, Patrick Mickle and I, plus the staff at Harvest Youth Club. We just submitted the grant application for 2018-2019. "**Promise Grant**" with Kids to Love organization, we just delivered 10, 8" Kindles and 50, \$10 gift cards to finish out the grant for this year. The grant application has again been submitted for 2018-2019. "**Beacon Grant**" that we use with our Tut Fann Veterans has just been completed by delivering a 43" Vizio TV to the activities director. The grant for 2018-2019 will be written within the next week. "**Freedom Grant**" that we used with homeless veterans and a soup kitchen has already been approved again for \$2,000 for 2018-2019. "**Impact Grant**" we use with Farley School will start up again as school starts. J.Appleseed Book Company just delivered to the school library, \$1,985 worth of books and ebooks using this grant. PLEASE consider helping us this fall and winter, we are in need of tutors, we need just an hour or so each week to listen and help these children with their reading and some help with the reward store. **PLEASE** take a look at the bulletin boards in the entryway for the updates on these grants and all the wonderful things we have done and are doing.


