

Happy New Year to All of You.

As 2017 comes to an end, I think it has been a year that all of our members should be proud of. We should be proud of all the accomplishments that we had and the contributions that were made to our community.

Our College Scholarship program provided an all-time high of \$37,000.00 in tuition help to 32 very deserving High School Seniors from our local schools. Our "Grant Think Tank" applied for and received every grant available from the Elks National Foundation. These Grants totaled approximately \$21,000.00 and have or will be put back in to our community to help our local Veterans in need, help to promote our Drug Awareness Program and provide for the betterment of Farley Elementary School.

We received a \$2,600.00 Grant from the Alabama Elks Trust that was used to host our annual Children's Christmas Party. We had approximately 50 kids from the Harvest Youth Club and the Boys and Girls Club as well as 28 Elk children attend. Each child received a gift and served as representatives of each organization to receive the larger gifts that each group requested to help their facilities. Flat screen tv's, X-Box games, soccer balls, building blocks, after school snacks and school supplies were bought totaling over \$4,000.00. Several members made personal contributions that added to the Grant and gave us close to \$4,000.00 to help these organizations. Attending this party and mingling and watching the kids is a very rewarding opportunity.

2017 saw our Lodge come together and build a whole new Bingo team. We have new callers and new volunteers to work and help with this great cause. Without Bingo the scholarships and the other \$30,000.00 we donate back to the community would not be available. I am very proud of those that stepped up to keep this great effort running.

One effort that does concern me is our membership growth. Each year we will lose 50 plus members due to many different reasons. That is to be expected. Last year we overcame those losses and grew our membership. This year we are still behind. We need each one of you to recruit new members that will be great Elks. Our future depends on it.

As we move in to 2018 the Elks will be celebrating its 150th Anniversary. We will again be having our "Open House in February. I want to incorporate this celebration in to that event. We will need to begin organizing the logistics to have this year's event this month. Please see me or let April know if you would like to help.

In closing, I would like to thank all of our members that worked on this year's Christmas Float. Our theme was a Winter Wonder Land and the float was just that. This group put in a lot of hard work and should be proud of the results. The parade is a great opportunity to publicize our organization, it allowed us to distribute drug awareness bags, colors and coloring books to the kids along the route. It is also a great way to spend time with fellow members and get to know each other.




