

ELKS PATRIOTISM (KOREA/VIETNAM)

The patriotism of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks was once again exhibited during the armed conflicts in Korea and Vietnam. When a shooting war broke out in Korea in 1950, the Elks responded by sending gift packs to our military personnel fighting there as they had in World War II. The same was done for our military personnel in Vietnam after hostilities commenced there. In 1951, the Secretary of Defense appealed to the Elks for help in procuring blood for our wounded in Korea. Within a few months, the Elks Lodges obtained over a half million pints. During the Vietnam War, the Defense Department was concerned with the morale of our 400,000 troops fighting communist aggression because of the anti-American sentiments being reported on the home front. After much discussion, it was decided that a "Letters from Home" campaign would help counteract the negative acts emanating from this country. The Elks again answered the call and flooded these fine young defenders of freedom with letters expressing Elks gratitude for the sacrifices they were making for our country. When the Elks learned that wounded veterans were sweltering in Tripler Army Medical Center in Hawaii that lacked air conditioning, they provided 24 air conditioning units so that these military personnel could recover in relative comfort. As you have seen here, the Elks again brought patriotism to the forefront of their beliefs as stated in its mission: "to quicken the spirit of American patriotism."



SECRETARY NEWS

Our Elves, Mary Cannon and Nicole Anderson, will be shopping for gifts for all these children. For our Elk members, sign up sheets are in the entry way (left side), so please let us know you will be bringing your children. We don't want any child to be without a gift.

BEACON GRANT - Ed Limback works diligently with our Tut Fann Veterans. They are in our Lodge the first Thursday of the month for dinner and he will be setting up a Christmas tree with the names and wishes of these veterans for our "Adopt-A-Vet" Christmas project. Please take a name, fill the wish, put the name tag on the bag and set it under the tree. These Vets love that we think about them 12 months of the year! **FREEDOM GRANT** – shopping has begun for our homeless veterans and we will be shopping for one of the soup kitchens that feeds them. If you have small to medium sized "gently used" suitcases, please donate them to us. These folks sometimes have nothing but a paper bag in which to carry their belongings. **IMPACT GRANT** – this grant is ongoing thanks to help from Cathy Kulas and Tom Rathz. This year we will also be working with Highlands Elementary as well as Farley Elementary. We need help once a month in our "reward room" store, and we need volunteers once a week (for about an hour) to listen to a child read and help with their words. Highlands has asked us for an outdoor classroom, so that they will be able to take their studies outdoors. More on that later and we will be asking for volunteers to help with this also. **We still need donations of copy paper, ink pens, #2 pencils, post-it notes, etc. for our teacher supply rooms at both schools.** Thank you for being so generous. Those that can't do physically, do in other ways!!
