

WHAT IS THE ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION: HOW CAN I HELP?

What Is the Elks National Foundation (ENF)? At the 1928 Elks Grand Lodge Convention the ENF was founded with an initial \$100,000 grant. The mission of the ENF is to help Elks build stronger communities. This pledge is fulfilled by investing in communities where Elks live and work. Youth are helped to develop lifelong skills, students are sent to college, veteran's assistance is provided, charitable work of state Elks associations is supported and Elk's communities quality of life projects are funded.

During the 2017-2018 grant year our Lodge received a total of \$17,500 in grant monies which was used to support the Floyd E. "Tut" Fann Veterans Home, Harvest Youth Club, homeless veterans, Kids to Love and Farley Elementary School. Our Lodge applied for and received all grant monies available for the 2018-2019 grant year. Every \$1.00 donated by our Lodge results in \$3.34 being returned to us in the form of grant monies.

SECRETARY NEWS

GRANTS - IMPACT GRANT - We are still working with this grant and doing great things at Farley Elementary School. We have tutors lined up to help with reading. We also will be working with **HIGHLANDS ELEMENTARY** this year. We are excited to have two great schools with which to share our grant and everything that goes along with it.

PROMISE GRANT is being used with "Kids to Love" again this year. Cathy Kulas and Jan Abbott will be doing their backpack program with them again as well as Christmas. Thanks to everyone that donated school supplies to our "basket" in the hallway. This will go a long way to fill the backpacks. As part of this grant they will be taking meals to the students in the KTEC classes there. These classes train students in Electrical and Mechanical Components, Electric Drives, Hydraulic Control Circuits, and Digital Fundamentals and Programmable Logic Controls. They will be able to work in an auto factory and many other areas of specialized training. When Cathy and Jan went over to talk about the meals, they were told "you are a God send", we didn't know who was going to step up for us. Please, if these ladies ask for a little help, be willing to help them. **Our grants MUST have Elk member involvement.**

ELKS PATRIOTISM . . .

WORLD WAR II

Elks Patriotism and generosity was clearly evident all throughout World War II. The Elks contributed to the war effort by providing for the members of the armed forces both abroad and at home. During World War II, Elks lodges spearheaded local recruitment efforts, directly helping to enlist more than 142,000 men into the armed forces as well as thousands of construction specialists who dramatically aided the war effort. Additionally, more than 400 lodges conducted refresher courses that qualified thousands of young men for training as Army flying cadets. The Elks also realized the need to boost the morale of servicemen stationed far from home. Across the country, the Elks sponsored 155 Elks fraternal centers, where GIs were invited to relax, socialize, and enjoy the hospitality of the Elks. More than one million servicemen visited the center in New York City. For those serving overseas, the Elks prepared and sent care packages containing candy, ceased, the Elks Grand Lodge had spent more than \$1.5 million, while local lodges spent hundreds of thousands of dollars more to provide assistance to our men in uniform. In 1999, the Elks approved a resolution pledging an amount equal to \$1 per member to the National World War II Memorial located at the National Mall in Washington, DC. This memorial will preserve the memory of the more than 16 million people who served in World War II. The Elks exceeded their pledge to this Memorial, generating more than \$1.22 million.
