A Letter From the Parents of Greg Moser

We want to express our deep appreciation for your many thoughtful kindnesses during our son Rev. Greg Moser's sudden walk with cancer last year and finally his recent passing. Obviously his fight did not go according to our hopes and plans. We know each of you have experience with various disappointments and well know the pain involved.

It is difficult to express just how appreciative we are. Living 7.5 hours away, we were not readily available to be of prompt help to Greg and Jennifer and Liam these past months. We are unable to personally thank each of you specifically. But we are most fortunate that we did get to meet and greet many of you and experience your generous sympathy and comfort as we attempted to cope in early January.

We fear we evidently did bring some mighty chilly Minnesota weather with us, and warmth was on our minds when we arrived upon your doorstep. We and family from various corners of the United States were strangers to you, with strange accents! We really were in need of warmth and hospitality. You took us in, fed us, and really outdid yourselves! It's no small endeavor planning and organizing, not to mention the plain hard work it took to arrange the luncheon you did, as well as the daily delivering of meals to our door!

One couple referred through your church did visit Greg during his last days on earth in South Carolina. They had never previously met. She wanted us to know she had worn a blue jacket and she will always remember his response, as weak as he was: "You have worn blue. Blue is the color of hope."

Even though you were not all dressed in blue you are living examples of our external hope! The color blue has taken on an additional meaning for us and we will always think of you at Epiphany as well when we see it...which will be quite often actually!








We treasure you and know that Greg truly treasured each and every action of yours that made his cancer walk easier, lent encouragement and comfort to his grieving family, and continues to uplift Jennifer and Liam as they strive to accept and adjust.

Quarterly Finance Update as of March 31, 2017

The financial condition of the congregation is healthy at this time. Continuing with the trend from the end of last year, offerings continue to exceed expenses for the church. Offerings for the first three months were approximately \$20,000 above budgeted expectations while operating expenses have been running slightly below expectations on a year-to-date basis. Therefore, while the trend is headed in the right direction, the finance committee and council will continue to review the receipts and disbursements to insure adequate reserves as we approach the summer period when we traditionally see a drop in offerings.

Dear Friends,

We have felt the loss of Pastor Jen's husband, Greg Moser, and continue to grieve with her. We want to support Pastor Jen in a tangible and specific way. We also know that our first priority is the well being of our children. So many people have asked how they can help, and caring for Liam is one area we can all rally around.

As mothers with small children, we understand that full time childcare can be almost as expensive as college: up to \$17,000 a year. Liam is three years old, and it will be three years until he is in the Elmhurst public school system for the full school day. We have felt the calling to help bridge this period, and to start a fund to help cover Liam's schooling and daycare costs. After much research, we felt called to set up a UTMA account.

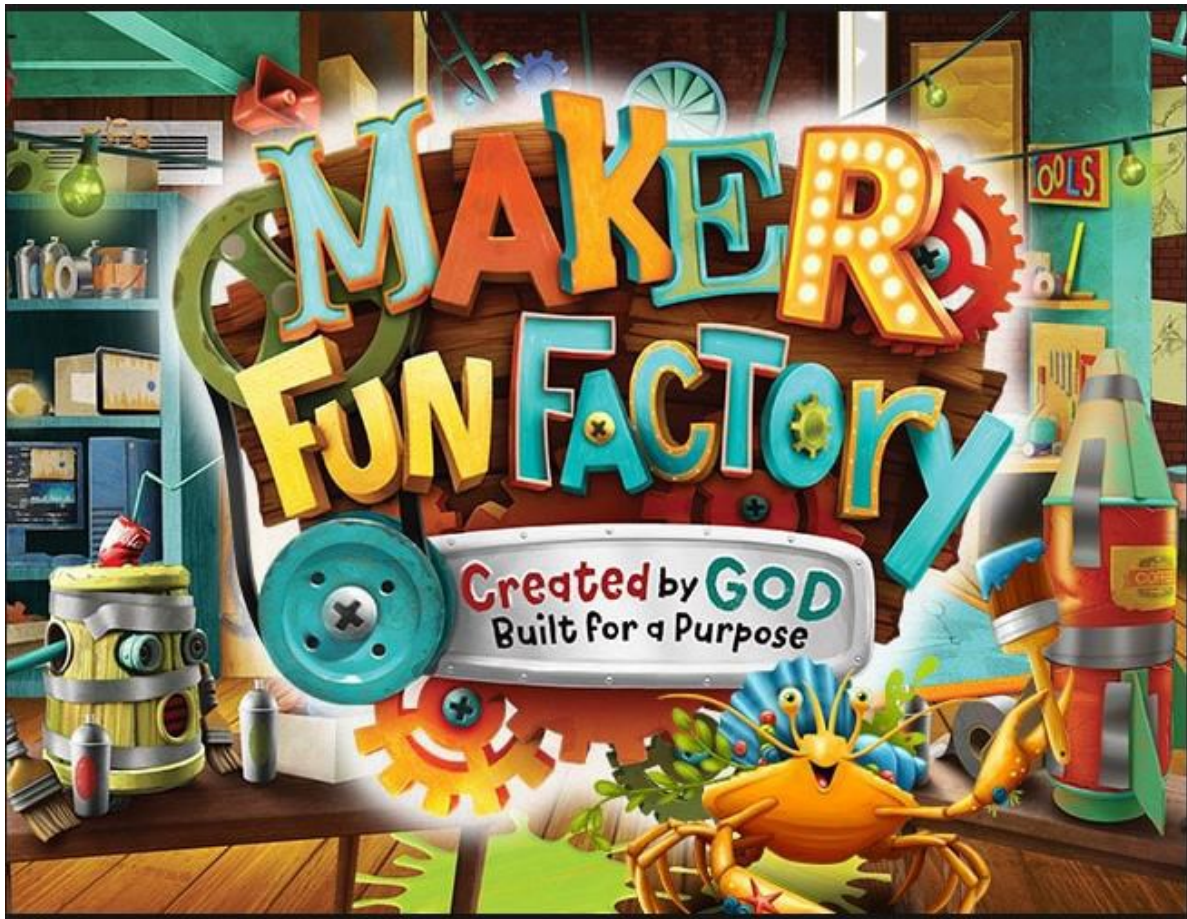

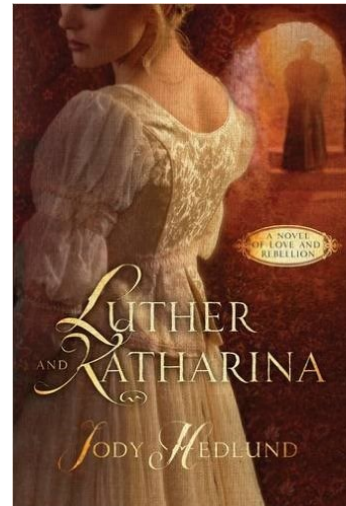

Reach out and Touch/Thinking of You: This ministry will ensure that our most senior members of the community are acknowledged occasionally throughout the year with a small reminder from the church. Groups within the church; confirmands, LYO, Sunday School will be one source of creative reminders but we are also looking for individuals who would occasionally be willing to make a short drop-off visit to ensure a truly personal touch. From Our Table to Yours: One Sunday a month, individuals or couples will deliver the consecrated bread and wine from our altar to homebound individuals. Ideally this will happen on Sunday following our service but in unique cases could be done later in the week. A short service will be provided for these volunteers to use and they will make one or perhaps two stops.

Special Kids Day

Last month, the Sunday School children learned of our next and last Mission Project for this year. We will collect **NEW** toys to be given to **Special Kids Day** for their December holiday party for children with special needs and their families.

Over the course of 25 years, Special Kids Day has grown from a local event to an annual tradition that attracts 600 children from across the western suburbs.

Founder Rich Rosenberg creates a holiday party designed specifically for children with special needs and their families. It features photos with Santa, crafts, homemade cookies, music, face painting and balloon blowers, as well as a quiet reading area. Families can drop in for as long as they like.

Mr. Rosenberg was inspired to start the event while photographing Santa at the mall. His wife, Barbara, had just started working as an aide to a boy with Cerebral Palsy, which is when Rosenberg realized that he wasn't seeing any kids with special needs getting their picture taken with Santa.

"They wouldn't and couldn't come to any event that was crowded and loud," explains Rosenberg. "Kids with autism or Down's or using augmented devices — they just couldn't come and get pictures. And so we decided to do something."

The atmosphere at Special Kids Day is designed for kids for whom a regular holiday party is too overwhelming or technically challenging. There is no standing in long, hot, crowded lines to visit Santa, and a professional photographer will spend as long as the child and parent needs to get the right shot.

The event is open not only to children with disabilities but individuals of all ages with special needs, as well as families and siblings. Mr. Rosenberg is especially sensitive to the struggles that siblings can have feeling left out or unable to participate in regular events, and he takes pains to include them in the event.

This Sunday School Mission project involves our Sunday School students selecting gifts for children they do not know. The hope is that our Sunday School student's parents will take their children shopping to choose a gift for another child. Individuals of all ages have special needs, so the age of the person is not as important as the appropriateness of the gift. Gifts that include the need for another to join in the fun are wonderful. Gifts that can be used to learn new skills are wonderful. All of the gifts must be brand new and unwrapped. Children can bring them to Sunday School and put them in the box outside the Kindergarten classroom. Thank you for assisting your child in this project!

The collection box can be found outside the kindergarten classroom on the lower level of Epiphany. The last day for the collection is **May 21** which is also the last day of Sunday School before summer. Won't you help your child experience the joy of giving to others in need?
