## *A Word from Pastor Feltman*



On Tuesday, November 8, Americans will go to the polls to choose our next leaders. For most, it's been a discouraging, even disgusting, election cycle. Instead of showing America's best, it seems to have brought about the worst in us. Even so, I come to this year's election day with the same kind of excitement I do every second Tuesday in November.

For thirty-two years, the senior pastor of my home church in Columbia, South Carolina, was Pastor George Meetze. In addition to his call at Incarnation Lutheran Church, Pastor Meetze was the chaplain of the senate of South Carolina. Like most people, I tended to be rather cynical about politics and politicians. But Pastor Meetze saw a different side of politics and always encouraged me to appreciate those who have a desire to serve the public through elected office. "They are just like you and me," he would say. "They just want to make our communities better places."

Pastor Meetze taught me that politics is holy work, but he also knew that our human efforts to create a better world are penultimate. He knew and taught that all that we do in life—even politics—is under the lordship of Jesus Christ.

Hoping that Pastor Meetze would approve, here are my thoughts about our upcoming election.

**Things will not be as bad as the loser predicts nor as good as the winner promises.** God doesn't give our human leaders that much power!

**The most important people in shaping what our lives will look like is not (gulp) President Hillary Clinton or (gulp) President Donald Trump, but you and me.** Our politicians have been poor models for human decency and healthy communication. We can choose not to follow their example and to treat one another with the kind of respect that honors Christ. A number of years ago, a popular bumper sticker read, "When the people lead, the leaders will follow." Let's model for our leaders how good and healthy people relate to one another.

**The most important thing is not what happens on November 8, but what happens in the days after that.** On November 9, there will be a lot off happy folk and a lot of angry, frustrated Americans. Many will feel that America is going straight into the toilet; others will be sure that we have been saved from the devil himself or herself. Neither is true. Who we elect matters, but who we elect is not nearly as important as who "reigns." As I said in last Sunday's sermon, no matter who the next president is, the steadfast love of the Lord will endure.

So get out there and vote. Voting is holy work! And pray for our nation. Not just for our leaders, but for yourself and others as citizens.

I'll see you in church on Sunday!

## Want To Make A Difference This Year?

### **Required Minimum IRA Distributions (RMD's):**

**Why not save yourself the tax?** Many retirees are required to take funds from their retirement accounts at age 70 1/2 but don't actually need these funds for their monthly living expenses. Here's one way to take those distributions TAX FREE:

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 first allowed taxpayers age 70½ or older to exclude from gross income otherwise taxable distributions from their IRA ("qualified charitable distributions," or QCDs), up to \$100,000, that were paid directly to a qualified charity. The 2016 Consolidated Appropriations Act has now made this a permanent benefit to all taxpayers. Not only are these funds donated to the church tax free, there may also be additional tax benefits as a result of the QCD.

### **Gifts of Appreciated Securities:**

**You can contribute securities tax-free.** Securities that have appreciated in value may be donated to Epiphany, and you pay no capital gains tax on the securities you donate. Epiphany sells your securities and uses the proceeds for its mission and ministry. Did you know that Epiphany has a brokerage account to accept in-kind transfers of securities such as common stock, mutual funds and Exchange Traded Funds (ETF's)? By transferring to Epiphany, the securities are not sold until they reach Epiphany's brokerage account. The full amount is then tax free, and allows you to potentially use the full amount as a charitable donation/deduction on your tax return making this a win/win situation. Please consider this as part of your year-end tax planning. Please call the church office to help make this transfer.



The plot is her grieving process, and Taylor Bills' illustrations are deep and cozy. The thinly veiled metaphor gives advice to mourners and their friends. The authors, Pat Schwiebert and Chuck DeKlyen, acknowledge that tear soup may be appropriate for small events as well as the death of a loved one. Readers of all ages and in all proximities to sad events can appreciate this book. It also includes a list of helpful websites and organizations.
