Policies, Procedures & Course Descriptions



The 2018 Roaring Brook PTA After-School Enrichment Program (ASE) will begin on January 8, 2018 and end on March 9, 2018. The week of March 12th will be for make-up classes only. There is no guarantee that a canceled class or an absence of an instructor will result in a make-up class. There will be no refunds for canceled classes for which there can be no make-up.

Please read this material entirely. It contains important information.

FEES

The fee for each class is listed in the registration form or course description booklet. All fees must be paid at the time of registration via PayPal. Scholarship money is available if the cost of an ASE class would represent an economic hardship. Contact our Principal Alison Porcelli or Assistant Principal, Erin Jaynes, prior to registration to request financial assistance. You must be a member of the Chappaqua PTA in order to register for ASE and membership dues (\$20) must be paid prior to registering.

CHANGES & CANCELLATIONS

All requests for cancellations and/or changes must be made during the registration period of October 29th - November 14th, 2017. PayPal processing fees will be deducted from any refunds issued for registration cancellation. **Once the registration period is closed, no cancellations, additional registrations and/or class changes will be accepted or refunds issued.** Insufficient class enrollment at the conclusion of the registration period will result in the cancellation of the class and registered participants in a cancelled class will either be given the option to register for other ASE classes or a refund.

During the ASE program, there is no guarantee that a cancelled class due to weather or an absence of an instructor will result in a make-up class. There will be no refunds for cancelled classes for which there can be no make-up.

ATTENDANCE

In order to keep track of children participating in ASE, we need cooperation from all parents. Prior to the commencement of the ASE program, each teacher will be provided with a list of his/her students participating in ASE on a given day. No note needs to be sent to your child's teacher unless your child will be missing his/her ASE class on a particular day. If your child is in school, but will not be staying for ASE on his/her scheduled day, you must update dismissal manager. Please leave a note in the main office if you unexpectedly pick up your child from school early (i.e. due to illness) and do not plan to send him/her to ASE that afternoon.

CLASS TIME

Classes will meet from 3:35-4:35pm, Monday through Friday. Classes will begin on January 8th and meet for seven or eight weeks, depending on scheduled school closings. **Please note no classes will be held on 1/15, 2/2 (half day) or during winter recess week (2/19-2/23).** If school is canceled, ASE classes are canceled. There are no classes on early dismissal days. Children are to report to the cafeteria at their regular dismissal time. You may send a snack for your child. A volunteer will supervise children until their ASE teacher picks them up. **Please remind your child when it is his/her day to stay after school.**

PICK-UP & LATE FEES

Please pick up your child at the appointed dismissal point. A list of dismissal points for all classes will be posted on the lobby door. If you arrive after 4:45 pm, your child should be picked up in the lobby. Children must

be signed out and picked up promptly at dismissal time.

There will be a \$15.00 fee for any parent who does not arrive for pick up by 4:45pm. In addition, there will be a charge of \$1.00 per minute for each minute your child is left at ASE after the ten-minute grace period. No child will be permitted back to ASE until all late fees are paid in full.

CLASS SIZE

If there is insufficient class enrollment, the ASE Committee reserves the right to cancel that class. You will be notified if the class that you have chosen has been canceled and given the option to enroll in another available enrichment class or payment refunded.

SNACKS

Please send your child to ASE with a snack and beverage from home. As there are students in the program with food allergies, please do not send snacks containing nuts or nut oils. Please remind your child not to share his/her snack.

ALLERGIES

The Roaring Brook PTA ASE Committee cannot guarantee the absence of food allergens in programs, including but not limited to snack time, chocolate, cooking or baking classes. In addition, certain classes may expose children to animal fur or dander. For the 2018 ASE program, there will be a nurse available during ASE hours to respond to any medical issues. During all non-food related classes, instructors will not bring any food products into classrooms or serve any food products to their students. We ask that you use your best judgment when registering for classes if your child has an allergy. Should you have any questions please feel free to contact your ASE chairs.

ASE 2018 Discipline Policy

We offer these classes for your child's enrichment and enjoyment. If your child's behavior is disruptive to the class, the ASE Chairs, class instructors and parent volunteers will adhere to the following protocol:

1) After the first incident, the child will receive a warning and a note will be sent home. A copy will also be sent to the ASE district chairpersons.

2) After the second incident, the child will be removed from that day's class and the parent will be notified in person or by telephone. No fees will be refunded.

3) After the third incident, the child will be required to withdraw from the class. No fees will be refunded.

You will be asked to sign a waiver at the time of registration stating that you have read and agree to the discipline policy and procedures for ASE Programs.

SNOW, INCLEMENT WEATHER AND EARLY DISMISSALS

If school is canceled or there is an early dismissal for any reason, ASE will be canceled and students will be sent home on their regular buses. If school remains open and it begins to snow or bad weather is predicted, the district may cancel all after school activities taking place in school facilities, which would include ASE, and the students will be sent home on their regular buses.

Check the school district website (www.ccsd.ws) for announcements. You may also register on the website for text-message and email alerts from the district. Local TV and radio stations often provide announcements of closings as well (NCCTV 75, 77, News Channel 12, WFAS 103.9, WHUD 100.7). **There will be no refunds due to snow cancellations.** We will do our best to reschedule these classes, subject to teacher and classroom availability.

Special Needs

All ASE classes are open to all Roaring Brook students according to the grade levels specified. When registering your child(ren) for any class, please carefully consider your child(ren)'s interest in and aptitude for certain types of activities.

If your child has special needs that may require accommodations and/or additional adult support in order to participate in ASE, please indicate so in a letter addressed to Dr. Heidi McCarthy, CCSD Director of Special Education and Related Services, at P.O. Box 21 Chappaqua, New York 10514. In that letter, please identify your child and indicate his/her school, grade and the ASE activity for which you plan to register him or her. A Section 504 Committee Meeting will then be convened to review your request. PLEASE NOTE: in order to allow for sufficient time prior to the start of ASE to review your request, please contact Dr. McCarthy immediately upon registration. PARENTAL NOTICE

Please note that there is some element of risk inherent in all ASE classes. There is an inherent risk of injury for anyone participating in a class involving physical activity. Nature classes may involve exposure to animal allergens.
