One of my prior churches had a mission partnership with a small town, Atebubu, in Ghana. The church raised funds for a badly needed kitchen at a local hospital, they provided backup generators for the town's water treatment and they helped build a new sanctuary for the local Presbyterian Church. I was part of a group from the church that visited our partners in Ghana. It was a long bus ride from the capital of Accra to the Atebubu. As we approached the town, we saw a crowd of people in the middle of the road in front of us. When the bus stopped at the town's edge, we realized that the crowd was waiting for us. A brass band started playing and the people began to sing. We tentatively stepped down from the bus not sure what would happen next. The people surrounded us in dance and song. Together we created a procession slowly making our way down the main road to the Presbyterian Church. I can honestly say that it was the first time I truly felt like a Rock Star! Once inside the church, the music continued with drums added to the brass band. There were more people, more singing and more dancing. The joyful cacophony took in all the senses. I have never experienced a friendlier welcome than from the Presbyterians of Atebubu Ghana!

A strength of Plymouth Presbyterian Church is our relationships with one another. We appreciate our connection as fellow Christians coming together to worship God. How do we translate that to others who join us? We may not have a band meeting them at the edge of our property to walk with them into our church building, but being welcoming and showing hospitality is an intentional endeavor which involves everyone. We cannot leave it to someone else to welcome, and provide hospitality.

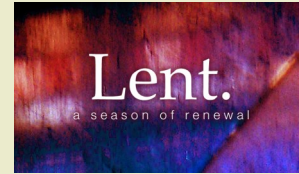
