Lighten the load. We are now officially into Lent. Lent is the 40 days before Easter (minus Sundays). The number forty is

frequently used in the Bible. Noah had forty days of rain on the Ark; the people of Israel wandered forty years before reaching the promised land; Jesus went into the wilderness for forty days before Satan tempted him. You get the drift. The number forty is significant. Most likely it was an approximate number that meant a long time. It was long enough for a major change to happen.

Lent can take a long time as we ever so slowly inch toward spring. It is long enough to make some changes. During this Lenten season, let us think about how we can lighten our load. We tend to accumulate things, not only material items but psychological ones as well. We hold on to the scars of how others have hurt us through slights, insults; through humiliating and harmful acts. The accumulation of it all can weigh us down. Let us lighten that load by sorting out what is necessary to hold, what harms us and what helps us to thrive. Then let us let go of the things we do not need. Whatever we carry, Jesus promises us that he is willing to share our burdens.

In lightening your load of the tangible or the elusive stuff, allow Jesus to take it from you. Jesus said, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest."

theme for this year's Lenten Services is "Getting to Know Jesus Through His I AM statements." Join us as we explore the following weeks:

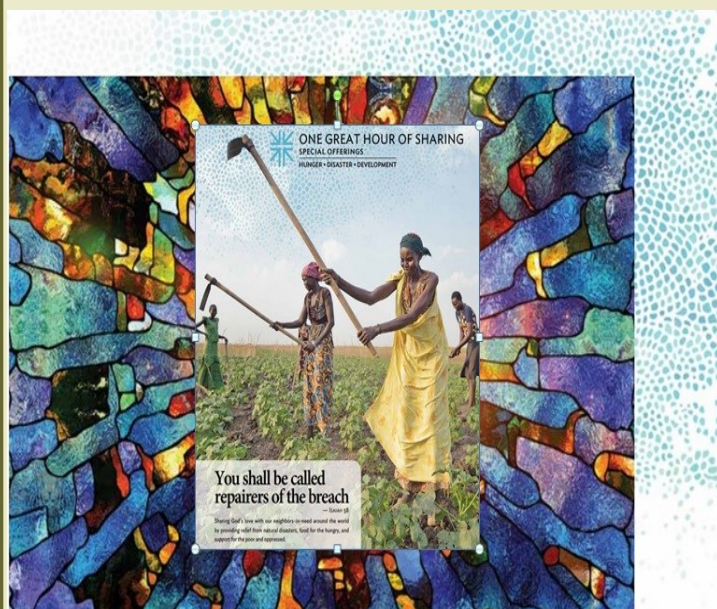
February 21 "The Great I AM; Yahweh"

ARE YOU CALLED TO BE VICE - MODERATOR?

The PTCA Nominating Committee (NC) asks all ruling and teaching elders in the PTCA and its member congregations to prayerfully consider if they sense a call to serve as Vice - Moderator of the Presbytery.

In keeping with the Presbytery efforts to have open communication and to identify and equip leadership, the NC is adopting a new process. Rather than the NC inviting a small number to apply, the invitation is extended to all minister members of the PTCA and all ruling elders in its member churches to prayerfully consider possible service in this role.

The Responsibilities of the Vice - Moderator include:

1. Participate as a member of the Presbytery Leadership Team.
2. Preside over Presbytery business meetings at the Moderators request.
3. Preside at Installations and Ordinations at the Moderator's request.
4. Perform duties of the Moderator in his / her absence.
5. Learn the duties of Moderator.

Have you enjoyed having "the bell band" in worship recently?

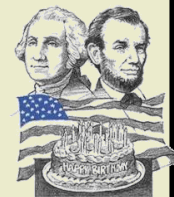
We are 6 wonderful people and looking for a few more to bring more beautiful music into worship once a month or so. Give us a try for our next handbell session!

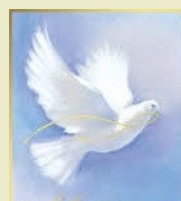
