**From:** Rev. Anne Fisher, Transitional Pastor

**Cornerstones:** In the 17 different congregations where I have served, I have had 17 different situations regarding the building. The structures ranged from over 100 years old to almost new. One church had metal bars crossing the wide sanctuary ceiling to hold the walls in place. I was afraid to ask what would happen if those bars weren't there! In another church the outside stone work had failed so completely that when it rained, bath towels had to be placed on the window sill of my office to stop the water from pouring in; a major tuck pointing and rehab is currently underway. Then there was Becky, who was unable to walk, but came every Sunday to teach Sunday School. In order to reach her classroom she would scooch up a flight of stairs on her bottom. It was a joy, that when I left an elevator had been installed so that she could reach her classroom with dignity and grace. Making these things happen meant members taking on an extra financial commitment so that their building could be used for the intentions of mission and ministry.

We have been blessed with a new, efficient and fully accessible building. This building is a gift from those who laid the foundation, and now it has been entrusted to us. Our responsibility is to ensure that it is here for generations to come. Our challenge is to pay the mortgage and free up the burden of debt for future members. Each generation has its challenges. We do not have to remodel or update or make accessible, but we do need to continue the responsibility to pay for what we have. Please pray about how you can help relieve our mortgage debt, as the Session considers a course of action.
