### **The courage to BLOOM.**



Bloom Early Learning & Child Care is currently raising funds to expand into Plymouth Presbyterian Church. Last fall our Session unanimously

agreed to partner with Bloom for the next four years with the option to renew. This is a courageous step that Plymouth Presbyterian is taking. It takes courage and patience for our congregation to adjust, accommodate and welcome Bloom as partners in ministry.

One of the accommodations is the physical change that will be made to our building. With those changes comes a shifting of our vision. When PPC was built and the addition was built, the vision was to make our building a welcoming place to bring members and their children into programs of our church. The thought was that the halls would ring with children of all ages on Sunday morning and Wednesday evening. As we have seen the children of our church grow up, our vision of valuing children remains the same but now the vision is expanded to include welcoming and accommodating children from the community coming from all faiths, five days a week, year-round.

To realize this expanded vision, it means some structural changes to our building. There will be a fence around our delightful playground with additional equipment to accommodate the littlest

ones. A Security system will be placed on one of the main entrance doors so that the children within our building can be safe from intruders. A small office will be walled in at the front of our nursery to accommodate administrators who will monitor and welcome parents. The room off the nursery will be used for cribs so that the babies can sleep peacefully. The art room and its adjacent classroom will be made into one classroom. The large room in the back will be a classroom for the older children and the large carpeted room will be used as a large motor room if the weather is too bad to go outside.

Our Bloom partnership, will require some shifting of our building's use. As our vision refocuses outward into the community, we have not lost our original purpose of serving Christ and reaching out to the least among us. 

## Interfaith Outreach

*Igniting the power of community*

**INTERFAITH OUTREACH** -- Igniting the power of community by: Engaging cross-sector community partnerships in delivery of family support, food, housing and neighborhoods, education and youth, employment, and transportation services that open doors to new and hopeful futures.

Interfaith Outreach and Community Partners provides services in the area most of our members live in, and we donated 67 pounds of food for the March Food Share collection.

Here are some tidbits about this nearly 40-year-old institution thriving under the leadership of LaDonna Hoy:

—Case Management Services works one-on-one with individuals and families to provide information, connections to resources, problem-solving assistance, advocacy, counseling, support and emergency financial assistance. From baby supplies to employment counseling, they can help or connect you to other agencies that can. All the while, they focus on building community.

—The Food Shelf takes donations from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday and we often give our monthly collections to them. Our congregation has been volunteering whenever there is a 5<sup>th</sup> Wednesday in a month. Mark your calendars for May 31!

—Resale Select volunteers hand-select top-brand donations and quality merchandise to sell in the store. It won “Best Boutique” and “Best Thrift Store” categories in the 2018 Readers Choice Awards in the Sun Sailor. Their motto is you can do

good by donating, feel good by volunteering and look good by shopping! The store is open 10:00a.m. -5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, Friday and Saturday.

—IOCP holds a plant sale in May to raise funds; packs food packages to deliver to seniors; creates transitional and low-income housing and provides services on-site; runs the annual Sleep Out campaign which our dedicated youth participate in; coordinates volunteer drivers with those in need; and on and on!

When Bloom Early Learning and Child Care got started in Messiah United Methodist Church, it was in conjunction with IOCP, both recognizing that helping a parent get a job doesn't help if there is not a safe and stimulating place for the children to spend their days. We will be expanding their mission of serving 50% scholarship, 50% full-pay children as they open their second location in our building next spring.

Let's hold this organization in our prayers and continue our long history of supporting them as they do such good works!


