Are we still in Lent?

There is a different dynamic being in the middle of something rather than being at the beginning or the end. The headiness of starting something new has worn off and the ending is not yet in sight. It takes endurance to get through those middle times. When I swim for exercise the middle laps are the most difficult and are the ones I try to simply get through. Lent is that way as well. Ash Wednesday was a while ago and Easter is not quite here yet. Life intrudes even our best intentions of making changes for Lent.

During the Sundays in Lent, we have been hearing about people whose lives have been transformed because of their encounter with Jesus. The Woman at the well in Sychar and Bartimaeus, who was blind from birth, were at the middle of their lives. The woman was getting water for another day of housework and Bartimaeus was setting up for another day of begging. It was at that point when they were enduring what always was, that they encountered Jesus and their lives were forever changed.

My hope is that Lent will intrude into your life this year. May Jesus find a way to be present in this middle time of Lent so that when we arrive at Easter, nothing will ever be the same again.




Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) Works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters.

We are seeking an Office Manager for Plymouth Presbyterian Church. A part-time position, 30 hours/week during the program year and 20 hours per week during the summer, providing administrative and clerical support services. Provides reception, communication and basic referral services about the church to members and the community at large. Operates with a high degree of independence with general work direction and support provided by the Teaching Elder. This position requires the highest level of confidentiality and discretion. PER CAPITA APPORTIONMENT
Every church is apportioned a share of the resources of the presbytery, the synod, and the General Assembly for ecclesiastical purposes. The amount to be paid is determined by the number of members in the church, the needs of the presbytery, synod, and general assembly, and in a manner that is fair to all. The amount to be paid this year per communicant member is \$33.75.

What does \$33.75 get you? A gallon of paint, a lunch for two? Or it can connect us with the larger body of Presbyterians. Each year the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly set a per capita of what they charge the church for each of its members. This year we are asked to pay \$33.75 for every member.
