The Candlelight Christmas Eve Service, at 9:00 p.m., is a service that is close to my heart. The format of the service is one that my father did for many years in his church. People would look forward to the service every year and missed it when he retired. His message began with the sanctuary in total darkness except for the lit Christ Candle. He lit candles as he spoke and gradually the sanctuary would lighten. From that one candle came the entire room filled with light. As choir and members sung Silent Night, the congregation would silently process out with lit candles. Taking what we have gotten in the service out into the dark world. It would add to the wonder if snow was gently falling when we left! Even so, the service has left an indelible impression on me. Although I cannot exactly replicate my father's skill, nor the service, I offer this gift of sharing his format with you on Christmas Eve. I have chosen not to include the Sacrament of Communion in either of the Christmas Eve Services, this year, but candles will be lit and Silent Night will be sung.

When you see any of these folks, thank them and let them know that whether they are ending their terms of leadership or are willing to serve, they are lifted up in our prayers.


