


Plymouth on Parade

PPC Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) Update!


We want you to know what's going on

behind the scenes in our

search for our next Pastor. We've made verbal announcements in several Sunday Worship Services; but hope to reach everyone through the Newsletter and Bulletins. Your PNC has been busy meeting weekly after our head pastor posting was approved by Session in July. Subsequently, a pastor posting was entered online for the PCUSA's online matching service.

Our initial match report from the end of July led to **32 candidates**, in addition to a few self-referrals. Three of these candidates in the match report, although active in the system, were already serving elsewhere or in final talks with another call. These applicants have been removed from the pool. One applicant determined we were not a good match for him and turned down the match. So, he too was removed. Presently, we are working hard to weed out poor matches. Soon, initial telephone interviews, with candidates we've chosen as good matches for PPC, will be scheduled. Please continue to pray for the PNC as we work to find the next vibrant leader for PPC's Pastor to lead us into the next chapter of our ministry!
