

# We Need YOU to Get Involved in Colorado's Every Student Success Plan!

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Last year, President Barack Obama signed a bipartisan bill called the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), overhauling the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) education law, which expired in 2007. The bill intends to usher in a new approach for K-12 education, in regards to accountability, teacher evaluations and the way the most poorly performing schools are pushed to improve.

Accountability provisions within NCLB have been maintained, such as tracking the progress of students in poverty and access to progress monitoring for children with disabilities, but states and local school districts now have the ability to address problems in a way that best meets the children and community whom they are uniquely serving.

Specifically, the new bill ensures alignment with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), and does the following for children with disabilities:

- Limits the use of alternate assessments to the 1% of students with the most significant cognitive disabilities.
- Requires states to hold all students to high achievement standards.
- Provides the necessary instructional supports and services to students with disabilities.

Colorado Department of Education (CDE) is busy working on how ESSA will be implemented across the state and is seeking ALL stakeholders to provide input into your local district, your neighborhood school, and YOUR child's experience. That means they need YOU!
