Beth's Blessings

Lately my mother has been enamored of Yogi Berra's comically wise saying, "When you come to a fork in the road, take it." I've read that Berra wasn't sure he originated the saying. The first time it appeared in public consciousness was in 1913, when it was used as a joke making use of the double meaning of fork. Eventually, Berra embraced the phrase, though, saying that he first used it while giving Joe Garagiola directions to his house. Along the way of the life of this quote, someone expounded on its essential wisdom beyond the humor: "Keep trying. Stay humble. Trust your instincts. Most importantly, act. When you come to a fork in the road, take it."

As I have heard my mother repeat the phrase over the last few months, it has become the voice of the Holy Spirit for me as the spiritual leader of the Lewis Memorial congregation. Friends, we have come to a fork in the road. Just as the physical location of Lewis Memorial is at a crossroads, so our life together as part of the body of Christ has come to a point of decision that requires us to trust and act on faith. We are called to move together following God's lead. When Yogi Berra gave Joe Garagiola directions, he claimed that either way he chose at the fork would get him to the same destination. Our crossroads is truly a fork in the road, with diverging directions. One direction takes us further toward the best we can be for the kingdom of God. Another direction takes us away from God's vision, along a path that leads to stagnation, continuing unsustainable habits that eventually reach a dead end.

The Finance Committee's report in this newsletter on page 5 reveals the crossroads. We must make difficult choices together, both for the short-term of daily operations and for the long-term of fulfilling our mission to be and make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. The lay leadership team and I are praying and working to articulate those choices and to lead us wisely through them. Will you take the fork in the road and be part of moving us farther down the path that leads to God's future?

We are always grateful for your faithful gifts to the general budget that supports the operation of the church. This includes vital financial obligations of staff salaries, the costs of running the facilities, and ministry that is the spiritual heart of who we are. During this month's stewardship campaign, we invite you to prayerfully consider your gifts to the church in 2018. If you are giving at your full capacity, take the fork and continue trusting God with your gifts. If you can stretch a little farther to give a tithe of 10% of your income, take the fork and trust God with your gifts. If you have not given regularly to the church, take the fork and trust God with a commitment to give. Every gift is a significant and faithful response to God. Every gift helps us to take the fork in the road together.

We are always grateful for your faithful gifts of service through your time and abilities. A church is a part of the body of Christ together. Worship is only one part of how we are called to be disciples of Jesus Christ. Each one of us has gifts of time and ability to share, and you are vital to the work of our ministry from the crossroads. As the Yogi Berra quote says, "Most importantly, act... Take the fork in the road." Let Cindy Vinson, Ministries Assistant, or me know what you can do, and volunteer to fill the needs of our ministry.

Our faith story gives us the example of the Hebrew people, miraculously released from their bondage in Egypt, running toward the promise of life and joy in the future God envisioned for them. They came to a fork in the road when they faced the Red Sea ahead of them and the Egyptian army's chariots approaching behind them. The Lord spoke through Moses, "Do not be afraid, stand firm and see the deliverance that the Lord will accomplish for you." This is the promise of our Christian faith. Staying on the path of God's vision will lead to the good God desires for us. Jesus assures us of resurrection and life. That promise holds true especially when the sea has not yet started to part, and we stand firm in trust by wading out into the water. We have come to the fork in the road. Let's take it!

A Message from our Finance Committee

Through September 30, we have received 57.18% of contributions needed to fulfill this year's budget. Our reserve for such a general operating budget short fall was \$47,807.86 in January. Year to date, our expenses have exceeded our contributions by \$55,714.15 thus depleting our reserve funds.

The Finance Committee and Administrative Council are making very difficult choices about how to pay bills for necessary expenses and meet our obligation to pay staff salaries. We are also working to craft a budget for 2018 that will more accurately reflect projected giving.

Bible Black Belts - Scripture with a Kick **Wednesdays | 6:30 pm | Sanctuary**

An active Bible Study teaching children about the books of the Bible for lifelong Bible competence and love of Scripture. Each month will be a different belt level that includes Words of Celebration, Words of Comfort, Words of Wisdom, and Words of Jesus. Activities will help children memorize Bible verses using activities that utilize physical motion in some way: games, reflection, movement, percussion, etc.
