THE FINE PRINT

Point Lobos State Natural Reserve has been a destination for visitors for over 50 years. Visitors with mobility issues can come and share the wonders of Point Lobos with the help of our **“Easy Access Adventure”**. All visitors are welcome including those using canes, wheelchairs or individuals with other challenges. On our Easy Access Adventure days, docents are stationed along designated trails with scopes, binoculars, otter pelts and more to make Point Lobos come alive!

The upper plateau **at Sea Lion Point** is flat and 90 feet above the water. **Headland Cove** and **Sand Hill Cove** are prominent and spectacular. There are two wheel chair accessible benches on the trail for relaxation and wildlife viewing. Look for otters and harbor seals.

The **Carmelo Meadow Trail** is flat and begins at the entrance station. The **Granite Point Trail** begins in front of the Whalers Cabin Museum. The two trails intersect at Whalers Cove and continue on to Coal Chute Point. The views of Whalers Cove and Carmel Bay are outstanding. During the nesting season Great Blue Herons are seen at Coal Chute Point building their huge nest in the tops of the pine trees. In April, Harbor Seals give birth just below our Whalers Cabin Museum, and raise their pups there through May.

Our newly reopened **Bird Island Trail** is a spectacular six-tenths of a mile round-trip trail, passing above gorgeous China Cove and Gibson Beach. A variety of birds are seen on Bird Island including cormorants and black crowned night herons. Many egrets and gulls forage in the cove. This path goes up an ADA approved short hill and is then level. The Harbor Seals also give birth at China Cove in April, and raise their pups through May.

Three push type wheelchairs are available for use. One is located at the entrance kiosk, one at Info, or one by calling the entrance kiosk at (831) 624-4909. Point Lobos is located on Highway 1, 2.2 miles south of Carmel.

Please contact us if you are planning to bring a group. Entry is \$10 (\$9 for seniors) for autos and vans up to 9 passengers, \$50 for small busses carrying from 10 - 24 passengers. Entrance fee discount cards for visitors with disabilities are available at the Monterey District Office (831) 649-2836, which allow a car to enter the park for \$5.00.
