

The Gardening Talks & Workshops committee of the Virginia Beach Master Gardeners plans and hosts a series of lectures and workshops for the public each year.

The one-hour **Gardening Talk lectures** are held at the Meyera E. Oberndorf Central Library, located at 4100 Virginia Beach Blvd, on Monday evenings throughout the year. All talks begin at 7 p.m. Speakers provide a variety of garden-related information appropriate for gardeners of all skill levels. The lectures are not sequential, so you can attend all or just your favorite topics. All talks are free and open to the public. No registration is required.

Workshops are scheduled throughout the year to provide a hands-on experience for attendees. Participants work directly with Master Gardeners to complete projects or learn first-hand skills and techniques for working in their own gardens. Workshops are free and open to the public, but pre-registration is required, as each workshop is limited to a certain number of participants.
