## Candidate for President-Elect

### **Terri Hogan Dreyer, Assoc. AIA, LSBID**

Owner & Founding Partner, NANO LLC

With degrees in both Architecture and Interior Design, more than 30 years of experience within the profession, and utilizing her experience and leadership, Terri is the design and management force behind NANO LLC, a MidCity-based architecture and interiors design firm. Terri is the Majority Managing Partner and is responsible for the business management and development for NANO, a certified woman-owned small business.

She has successfully designed and managed many historic renovation projects valued at a total of over \$25 million. Her involvement on projects of various sizes and complexities allows her to integrate elaborate program requirements into successful building designs. Terri was an adjunct professor at Tulane University for four years where she executed and led the second year design studio, as well as taught design theory lectures.
