









This summer, twelve Ohio State undergraduates were selected to conduct high-caliber, scientific research at Germany's top research institutions as interns through the RISE (Research Internships in Science and Engineering) program.

The DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) created the highly competitive RISE program in 2005 to promote international collaboration in the sciences, offering undergraduates in STEM fields from the U.S., the U.K., and Canada the opportunity to work with research groups at universities in Germany during the summer. RISE interns receive a living stipend and are matched with research mentors in their laboratories. Eligible students must have completed at least 2 years of a degree program by the time of the internship placement, and must maintain undergraduate status after the internship has taken place.

After completing his RISE internship, Tyler went on to become a Goldwater Scholar, Churchill Scholar, and NSF Graduate Research Fellow.
