Learn why Gettysburg is known as the turning point of the Civil War and hear stories about the men who fought here July 1, 2 and 3 in 1863. The day will end with a Wreath Laying Ceremony at the Eternal Peace Light Memorial with a commemorative speech by a surprise special guest who made his own mark on Gettysburg in 1863 – something you won't want to miss!
