No Room at the Inn? How to register for our Christmas Services!

Sunday by Sunday this Fall, we've been able to accommodate walk-ins who were unable to pre-register for a given worship service. With (Christmas) demand almost certain to exceed (seating) supply, we've needed to take a different approach.

The gospels tell us: "In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered...." And, to make a long story short, Joseph's wi-fi was down and Mary had zoom fatigue, so they were a bit late registering and, well, we all know how that paragraph ends: "...there was no room for them in the inn."

Building on that rich, 2000 year legacy of 'registering for Christmas,' attendance at our in-person Christmas services this season will be *by registration only*. In order to safely seat as many folks as possible, you **must** register ahead of time (and receive confirmation of the same) in order to attend.

Here's how this is going to work: An email will be sent to our Anchor distribution list on **Monday, December 13**, inviting you to sign up for **1 (and only one)** of our **3 in-person Christmas services**. That is, we invite you/your household to decide ahead of time which one of our 3 in-person services you want to attend (i.e., Christmas Eve 7 pm, Christmas Eve 9 pm, Christmas Day 10 am). Of course, you may wish to tune into our Christmas Eve 4 pm Zoom service, or to watch the live-stream of our Christmas Eve 7 pm service any time you like...registration applies only to our in-person services. Registration will close by midnight on Monday, December 20, or as soon as registration is full, whichever comes sooner.

Once registered, your name will show up on a seating chart and you'll have your very own portion of a pew assigned to you. If, having registered, you find yourself unable to attend for any reason, please be in touch with **Jade** immediately in the office so that we can allow another to fill your reserved spot (jacuna@stclements-church.org).

Should you need to phone-in your service registration, you may leave a message for Jade at **(416) 483-6664 x224**.

Thank you for working with us to ensure we can make room in the inn for as many as possible!




Church in the Car


- **Wednesdays at 8:30am**, join us via Zoom for a weekly image and reflection from our Honest Advent book, led by our Clergy.

Children's Ministry update

Earlier this fall we asked for parent feedback around the shape of Children's Ministry in our current climate. We followed up with a parent zoom night to talk out what was shared. Here is a snapshot of what we learned:

- The transition back to in-person school has been tough
- While there is an appreciation that online Children's ministry is offered, for the vast majority of kids, online isn't doable anymore. The kids are zoomed out.
- The vast majority of parents are not ready to come back to in-person, indoor worship at this time. This will change as vaccinations for kids roll out.
- Kids are missing connection with other kids from church.
- More than half of families would connect in-person as families if we offered a way to connect outside.



Given all of this, as of December:

- We will begin to offer outside Children's Ministry opportunities for families (parents/grandparents & kids) that align with current COVID guidelines.
- We hope to add more opportunities for outside connection throughout the winter months!
- We will be pressing pause on weekly Sunday online Children's Ministry. We offer our sincere thanks to our incredible volunteers who have kept this ministry going the past four months

With vaccination of children under 12 beginning, we are hopeful that parents will be ready to head back to in-person as more families are fully vaccinated. We are looking forward to a renewed time for Children's Ministry in the months to come and remain committed to engaging our youngest members of St. Clement's in learning to follow Jesus.

REACHING OUT

Newcomers (Refugees): Calling for Donations

Our current situation: St. Clement's parish has a long and very generous history of supporting refugees from other countries in turmoil including displaced persons from Vietnam, Somalia, Syria and Eritrea, just to name a few. **We are writing now to ask you to support this work again.**

Our most recent history: Our Refugee Committee made an appeal to the parish in 2015 to raise funds to sponsor Syrian refugees, a country in great devastating upheaval at the time. We received a tremendous response from our parishioners -- **\$125,000**. With these donations, our Church was able to support directly and indirectly a dozen newcomers to Canada.

What about the people in Afghanistan? A number of St. Clement's congregants have stated that they want to support Afghani people who are now in danger as a result of the withdrawal of US and Canadian troops and the resurgence of the Taliban. We have been monitoring this situation and would like to be in a position to support one or more Afghans in the new year to resettle in Canada.

Why donate? Your Newcomers (Refugee), Outreach Committees and a number of individuals want to step up and continue to play an active role in refugee resettlement. **To what level will depend on YOU.** We are still committed to supporting Maharatab, from Eritrea. However, with enough donations, we would be able also to support an Afghani refugee or even a family.

So please prayerfully consider this need. **Please donate.** Send your financial donations to the church, clearly marked **"For Refugees"**.
