

# Children's Blended Case Management



Blended Case Management (BCM) provides assistance to children\* with serious mental health or co-occurring substance use disorders and their families. The role of BCM is to empower parents/guardians to manage on their own, without outside intervention.

## We serve the following school districts:

- Palisades
- Pennridge
- Quakertown
- Souderton
- Parts of Central Bucks, North Penn, and Upper Perkiomen

## Our community-based services include (but are not limited to):

- **School**
  - Support at IEP meetings
  - Observations of child in the classroom
  - Support families in finding their voice to meet their child's educational needs
- **Home**
  - Access resources – transportation, food pantries, benefits/entitlements, etc.
  - Observe child at home
- **Community**
  - Monitor and observe child in the community
  - Support with exposure and linkage to sustainable community resources such as groups, parks, clubs, etc.
- **Treatment**
  - Connect to services
  - Medication checks, psychiatric evaluations, therapy appointments
  - Liaison between pediatrician and MH providers
  - Second set of eyes/ears with doctors, therapists, etc.
  - Collaboration with services involved with the family as appropriate/needed to ensure communication among services (can attend meetings)

Referrals can be made by anyone on the child's team, which can include a family member, teacher or guidance counselor, pediatrician, or other formal or informal support. Self-referrals are also accepted.
