Join us **January 2025** for **FREE Online** Naturalization Preparation Classes

The **Museum of the American Revolution**, in partnership with the **San Francisco Public Library**, offers free civics and history classes to help immigrants prepare for the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services naturalization exam.

- PARTICIPANTS** Classes are open to anyone considering taking the U.S. citizenship test and are accessible for intermediate-level English language learners.
- DESCRIPTION** This course includes the Museum of the American Revolution's rich collection of objects, art and stories to help teach the main components of the citizenship exam: American Government, American History and Integrated Civics.
- LAST CLASS** Our final class features a special information session presented by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services community relations officer, providing helpful resources on the citizenship application process, eligibility screening, and the personal interview.
- TIMES & DATES** **Mondays and Wednesdays, January 6 - 29, 2025**
6 - 7:30 p.m. Eastern Time for a total of 8 sessions. Please note that this class will be accessible to **San Francisco Bay Area** residents on the same dates, **3 - 4:30 p.m.**

All students who successfully complete the course receive a one-year individual membership to the Museum, a dedicated guided tour of the Museum's exhibitions, invitations to special Citizenship alumni events, and a pocket Constitution.
