

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE REGULATIONS

NAME

The official name of this committee shall be Assumption Greek Orthodox Church Scholarship Committee.

OFFICERS

The Scholarship Committee shall consist of a Chairman, selected by the Parish Council President and Stewards in good standing appointed by the Chairman for a period of two years.

ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

The guidelines by which the Scholarship Committee shall abide are the following:

A. Numbers and Amount of Scholarship:

The number of scholarships to be granted to undergraduate, graduate, and seminarian applicants from high schools, colleges universities, and graduate schools and the amount paid for each scholarship group shall be determined by the Parish Council, annually.

B. Applications:

1. Interested applicants shall obtain an application from the Church office or online.
2. Each applicant must complete and mail the application to the Church office, with the attention of the Scholarship Committee Chairman no later than May 31st in order to be eligible for funds for the following fall term.

C. Report to the General Assembly

The Chairman of the Scholarship Committee or his/her authorized representative shall be required to give a complete report to the general assembly consisting of:

- Number of Applicants
- Name of recipients
- College or University attended
- Amount of each gift

SCHOLARSHIP RULES

A. Undergraduate Students:

1. The applicant or one of his/her parents or legal guardian must be a member of the Assumption Greek Orthodox Church for at minimum the last two (2) years immediately prior to the application year.
2. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of scholastic ability and volunteerism.
3. The applicant must be enrolled in or accepted by an academically accredited college/university or Orthodox Seminary.
4. The scholarship application form must be accompanied by:
 - a. For high school graduates
 - i. an official high school transcript,
 - ii. letter of acceptance from an accredited college/university, and
 - iii. recommendation letters from two (2) high school faculty members.
 - b. For students already in college
 - i. an official college transcript of the previous year (two semesters or three quarters).
5. All extracurricular activities must be recorded on an official transcript or otherwise documented.
6. The scholarship is given for one (1) school year.
7. A student may not receive the scholarship for two consecutive years.
8. Candidates must have a GPA of at least 3.0 and be fully matriculated.
9. New applications are required each year.

B Graduate Students:

1. The applicant or one of his/her parents or legal guardian must be a member of the Assumption Greek Orthodox Church for at minimum the last two (2) years immediately prior to the application year.
2. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of scholastic ability and volunteerism.

3. The applicant must be enrolled in or accepted by an academically accredited college/university.
4. The scholarship application form must be accompanied by:
 - a. For college graduates,
 - i. a letter of acceptance from an accredited graduate school and
 - ii. an official college transcript.
 - b. For students already in graduate school,
 - i. an official college transcript of the previous year (two semesters or three quarters).
5. All extracurricular activities must be recorded on an official transcript or otherwise documented.
6. The scholarship is given for one (1) school year.
7. A graduate student may receive the scholarship only once.
8. Candidates must have a GPA of at least 3.0 and be fully matriculated.
9. New applications are required each year.
10. The graduate student must be a “full-time” student.

C Seminarian Students:

1. The applicant or one of his/her parents or legal guardian must be a member of the Assumption Greek Orthodox Church for at minimum the last two (2) years immediately prior to the application year.
2. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of scholastic ability and volunteerism.
3. The applicant must be enrolled in or accepted by an academically accredited college/university or Orthodox Seminary.
4. The scholarship application form must be accompanied by:
 - i. For high school graduates
 1. an official high school transcript,
 2. letter of acceptance from the Seminary
 3. recommendation letters from two (2) high school faculty members.
 - ii. For college graduates,

1. a letter of acceptance from the Seminary
2. an official college transcript.

iii. For students already in the Seminary

1. an official college transcript of the previous year (two semesters or three quarters).
5. All extracurricular activities must be recorded on an official transcript or otherwise documented.
 6. The scholarship is given for one (1) school year.
 7. A Seminary student is eligible to receive a scholarship annually.
 8. Candidates must have a GPA of at least 3.0 and be fully matriculated.
 9. New applications are required each year.
 10. The graduate student must be a “full-time” student.
