

Q6 How often do you attend worship services at St. Luke's?





Q8 How long does it usually take you to travel from home to church?



Q9 How long have you been attending St. Luke's?



Q10 What is your personal history in the Episcopal Church?



Q16 In how many church organizations, committees, and groups do you hold membership (not counting congregational membership itself)?



Q17 Has your involvement in the congregation increased, decreased, or remained the same in the last few years?



The individual must be able to work as a collaborative partner with his vestry, lay leaders, church members and community so together the church is strengthened and vital to the church mission and vision. When it comes to financial management the rectors role should be over site with the finance committee.

Strong focus on service to our congregation. Give people more reasons to participate, meet individual needs!!!

Must be able to draw in younger families and single people of all types, encouraging youth groups and family participation. We don't need someone whose major ambition is to conduct a lot of funerals and then retire or leave. We need someone who can build TOLERANCE for others in this parish.

For questions 29-31, a lot of areas were addressed with specific details. Thoughts and ideas which occurred at the highest frequency are summarized below.

Question 29:

When asked about the current strengths of St. Lukes, you repeatedly described our church as welcoming, friendly, and inclusive. Many mentioned outreach and community service. The music ministry was also emphasized by many.

Question 30:

When asked about “opportunities for growth” at St. Luke’s, the need for programs to attract and involve children, youth and families was paramount. Contemporary and creative worship was suggested by many respondents, as well as Christian education for all ages. Many mentioned the need to do a better job of getting the word out to our community about what is happening at St. Luke’s. Improving and updating our website was emphasized as a part of this.

Question 31:

When asked about “preparing for the future,” the committee found two overwhelming suggestions. One, find a rector who will be able to bring new energy, ideas, leadership, compassion, and management skills to St. Luke’s. Two, we need to reach out into the community in order to better understand the direction and growth patterns that are occurring in the Quad City area and how St. Luke’s may be able to attract those people in need of a church family with an eye toward younger families. This will include providing programs and services that attract youth.

St. Luke’s needs to continue and expand our outreach programs. Improve our communication with the public and continue our on-line service for those who are unable to attend services. Strive to be open to new ideas while maintaining our identity knowing that we cannot be all things to all people.

Other suggestions include more Christian Formation/Education, Spiritual Development and restarting the Contemporary Services. Provide socializing activities such as bus trips, pot lucks, travel programs, etc. We need to be willing to face and address the issues that tend to divide us.

We also heard desires for continued COVID restrictions, to educate the parish to help those who have experienced PTSD as a result of what has happened in the last few years, and those experiencing compassion fatigue. Making better use of our volunteers, concerns with the environment, and our relationship with the Diocese were also mentioned.

Question 32:

The overriding feeling from respondents is that we are a friendly, welcoming church inclusive of all people. We offer stability and tradition through the structure of our worship and the Book of Common Prayer (BCP). A large number of responders like and support the strong music program not only in the worship service but also in our welcoming support of music that other groups bring to the church.

Most respondents feel that they thrive in the liturgy of St. Luke's and the Episcopal traditions. Our outreach through Don't Spend Christmas Alone sets us apart in the community at large. St. Luke's was described as welcoming of all people through a strong openness and tolerance for different ways of thinking.

Question 33:

Many comments addressing this question were to thank the committee for the work it is doing in beginning the search for our new priest. Keeping the congregation aware of progress is important to some.

There are many references as to the kind of person St. Luke's hopes to attract. Someone vibrant, engaging, forward thinking, both progressive and traditional, and one who listens but does not try to please all people. Someone non-political with no agenda to promote. Other responses were themes repeated from previous questions.
