

In 2008, Eddie Mefford wrote about Moses' initiative 10 years prior, "The word of Moses' love and compassion quickly spread. Others came to cook, help and serve. Those who felt unloved and alone discovered there was a warm fellowship and good food at Granite Creek. Rev. Peter Perry offered the Church for cold weather and a full-fledged year round soup kitchen was born, through Moses' love."

Part of what she wrote follows: "Dad's comments that we were 'serving' or 'eating' with Jesus were mystifying - I never saw the man from my picture Bible hanging around in the crowd; occasionally I would study faces on certain bearded men just to be sure. As I grew up, I spent more time behind the serving line and came to realize what a unique community it is. Over the years I've heard stories I never would have anywhere else, and seen people's lives change completely because of a simple Saturday lunch served in Jesus' name. I'll be grateful for the Saturday Feed as long as I live."
