

“Help, I have fallen and cannot get up”

Likely you have seen the commercial showing a person on the floor saying,

“Help, I have fallen and cannot get up.”; The purpose of the commercial is to help people be safe in their homes and obviously to sell fall alerts. These are amazing pieces of equipment and can make a huge difference in helping people stay safe.

Following hip replacement surgery and having challenges with my leg and foot, Sara Meyer suggested I might consider ordering a fall alert. As one who is not bothered by much and generally not afraid of things, I realized I was fearful of falling. Living alone, I understood I was vulnerable to falls. My children asked what I wanted for Christmas, I told them my concerns and they ordered a Phillips Lifeline Alert as a gift. As I was expressing my gratitude, they thanked me for asking for the fall alert before they told me I needed it. It is comforting to know that should I fall, a signal goes immediately to the company and they check to see if I have fallen or need help, will notify 911 for assistance and notify my children.

One reason for bringing up the subject of fall alerts is because a friend died recently. He fell in his bedroom, crashed onto his face, was unable to get up and did not have a phone with him. Unfortunately, he lay on the floor for 6 days before his brother, who had been unable to reach him, went to check on him. He was admitted to ICU for a number of days before being transferred to a rehab facility. 2 days later, he died.

I truly believe, had he had a fall alert he would have had immediate help and the outcome likely would have been very different.

If you live alone, please consider protecting yourself by researching and ordering a fall alert. Included is a Prayer for Those Who Live Alone
