

Calculus Detection Beyond the 11/12 Explorer

Course Description:

The primary goal of periodontal therapy is to remove biofilm and calculus deposits to promote a healthy periodontium. In order to accomplish this task, a variety of instruments are utilized subgingival to thoroughly detect and remove calcareous deposits. The ODU 11/12 explorer is the most commonly used instrument in calculus detection during clinical practice and in clinical licensure examinations. The instrument's thin tip allows vibrations to transfer from the tip to the handle which enhances tactile sensitivity for the practitioner. In addition to the ODU 11/12 explorer, other technologies are available to help practitioners detect calculus subgingivally but can be costly. These methods include endoscopy, autofluorescence, spectro-optical technology, lasers, and ultrasonic-based devices. Since the visualization and detection of calculus in the subgingival environment is impossible without assisted technology, tactile sensitivity through different instruments can be effective in the evaluation of calculus. This presentation will review the evidence in calculus detection technologies and discuss how efficiency in dental hygiene care may improve by using ultrasonic instruments in both the detection and removal of calculus.

- Identify methods of detecting subgingival calculus
- Describe the advantages and disadvantages of existing calculus detection technologies
- Choose appropriate techniques for calculus detection based on evidence

Michele Carr, RDH, MA is faculty Emeritus and former Chair, Division of Dental Hygiene at The Ohio State University, College of Dentistry in Columbus, Ohio. Michele has been involved nationally and locally serving on numerous professional committees such as the American Dental Education Association's Council of Allied Dental Program Directors, The American Dental Education Association Continuing Education Advisory Committee, the American Dental Hygienists' Association Council on Policy and Bylaws, The Ohio Dental Hygienists' Association Government Relations Committee and the CODA Dental Hygiene Review Committee. She currently serves on the Ohio State Dental Board, is a member of the CDCA-WREB, and is president of Carr Educational Consulting, LLC providing services in the areas of dental hygiene accreditation and continuing education.

“How It Impacts Your Patients, Your Family, and the Public’s Health”


Course Description:

The use of tobacco and nicotine products continues to create serious health compromises to those addicted to their use. The harmful effects to the lungs, heart, and many other organ systems will be discussed along with the varied significant compromises to the oral cavity, with the most dangerous being oral cancer. This program will also help wade through the various types of cigarettes, pipes, combustibles, non combustibles, and vaping products on the market today. Learn how companies keep modifying these products to adapt to the ever changing public health concerns and outcries. There will be a thorough review of the recent impact of e-cigarettes and JUULs on adults as well as elementary and secondary school students.

Course Objectives:

- Learn about the history of tobacco and nicotine products
- Know what tobacco and nicotine products are currently being used
- Understand how various products deliver nicotine
- Learn how e-cigarettes changed the approach of the tobacco industry to reach consumers
- Learn how the use of these products can compromise one's systemic and oral health
- Understand how children's health is being threatened by these products
- Be better prepared to answer questions from patients, friends, and family members on this subject

Nevin Zablotsky, DMD received his dental and postgraduate degree in periodontology from the Tufts University School of Dental Medicine. He has lectured throughout the U.S. and internationally on tobacco related issues, was a lecturer for the ADA Cell Seminar Series, lectured at the 2017 ADA Annual Meeting, twice at Yankee Dental Conference, and presently has two online courses for Procter and Gamble Company. He recently authored a chapter on tobacco and oral health, and tobacco cessation in the periodontal text book, "Non-Surgical Control of Periodontal Diseases" and has numerous published articles on tobacco and nicotine issues. He received the Vermont Advocate of the Year award from the American Cancer Society and the lifetime achievement award for the Vermont Special Olympics and was the past president of the Vermont Periodontal Society. He presently is a senior consultant and lecturer on tobacco curricula at Nova Southeastern University Dental School.



21st Century Preventive Care: Are you practicing in this century?

Course Description:

Course Description: Dental hygienists have treated patients using traditional methods for decades and while this approach is sufficient to remove local deposits on teeth, it does not address biofilm. Oral biofilm has been implicated in numerous systemic conditions and dental professionals have a unique opportunity to remove biofilm effectively and efficiently. This promotes a positive impact on oral health and mitigates the oral contribution on the exacerbation of systemic health conditions. GBT (Guided Biofilm Therapy) has revolutionized preventive care. This webinar will describe GBT, implementation (including caries management), and clinical and practice management outcomes of integrating this into clinical practice. In addition, strategies for promoting long-term restorative outcomes will be described.

Survival of the Fittest: What it Will Take to Run a Successful Practice in the Next 10 Years

Course Description:

This lecture will cover how to make your practice more resistant to the post-pandemic economy, what you can expect to see in the economic near future, and basic financial steps you must take to ensure that you will be able to financially be successful throughout your entire dental practice career.

Dr. Huot will go over the basic requirements you will need to ensure financial stability in a solo, small or large group setting, including steps to take now to ensure your retirement is on track regardless of the health of the economy, what financial "traps" to avoid, and how the future economy and health care reform will dramatically change the way you practice dentistry.

Topics such as associateships, acquisitions and mergers, and the buying and selling of practices will be discussed, as well as how you can position your current practice to thrive in the next decade and beyond.

Course Objectives:

Participants who take part in this course will: Identify basic economic business cycles, and how it affects dentistry.

- Understand the penetration of corporate dentistry/large group practice models in both Fee for Service and PPO systems, and how a solo practice is at a distinct disadvantage in competing with their business model.
- Gain knowledge on current economic trends that are happening with the third-party financing of dental care, and how they will need to market their practice in a radically different way.
- Return to the office with clear initiatives on how to increase the efficiency of their operations, and whether they are a candidate for a merger or acquisition of another dental office.

Rick Huot, DDS is the founder of Beachside Dental Consultants, Inc. Dr. Huot retired from the USAF Reserve Dental Corps, after 30 years of military duty, and his last assignment was as the Commander of the 920th Aeromedical Staging Squadron at Patrick AFB, FL. He served on active duty from 1982 to 1985. Dr. Huot is a Fellow in the American College of Dentists, the International College of Dentists, the Academy of General Dentistry, the Pierre Fauchard Academy. He currently serves on the Florida Dental Association Board of Trustees, and in the FDA House of Delegates. Dr. Huot was a private practice owner from 1985 to 2008, and still practices clinical dentistry. Dr. Richard Huot served on the American Dental Association, ADPAC board from 2008-2012. He is presently on the ADA Council of Government Affairs, and is a current professional content contributor to the Colgate Professional website. Women Dentists as Practice Owners

- Current data on gender, income, leadership positions and satisfaction trends of female practitioners as compared to males participating in the health care system (from students to mature practitioners).
- Possible explanations for observed trends, understanding the variables that influence these trends.
- Professional strategies for closing the gaps between female and male healthcare practitioners
- Identify meaningful personal and organizational strategies and goals to assure professional equity between male and female practitioners through guided discussion among the participants.

Dr. Kathleen O'Loughlin is the executive director of the American Dental Association (ADA). Dr. Kathy O'Loughlin is a nationally recognised leader in the healthcare, nonprofit and education sectors, who speaks around the country about the profession of dentistry, oral health care delivery, public health policy, dental practitioner mental health and wellness, interprofessional collaboration within health care delivery, and on the need for diversity within the dental profession. The first female executive director of the American Dental Association, Dr. O'Loughlin holds faculty appointments at both Tufts University School of Dental Medicine and the University of Illinois at Chicago College of Dentistry. The recipient of multiple awards including being named in 2016 as an Icon in Oral Health by the Forsyth Institute, Dr. O'Loughlin is a member of many associations including the ADA, the American Association of Women Dentists, and the Tufts University School of Dental Medicine Alumni Association.

Current Issues in Oral Health

Course Description:

This presentation will begin with an overview of the U.S. Public Health Service and relationship between the USPHS and various stakeholder groups such as state partners. Oral health inequities will be described along with the factors that cause those inequities, which will provide the foundation for a discussion of the key messages for the recently released Oral Health in America: Advances and Challenges Report. Finally, multi-directional integration of oral health and overall health will be discussed, including opportunities for oral health professionals.

Course Objectives:

- Describe the rationale behind multi-directional integration of oral health and overall health;
- List at least two key oral health disparities as they relate to race, ethnicity, and income;
- Describe four key messages from the NIDCR report, Oral Health in America; and
- List at least one Healthy People 2030 oral health objective.

SPEAKER



Rear Admiral Timothy L. Ricks, DMD, MPH, FICD currently serves as the 20th Chief Dental Officer of the U.S. Public Health Service as well as Assistant Surgeon General, a four-year term appointment he has held since September 2018. He serves as the Surgeon General's spokesperson on oral health and interacts with chief dental officers from other countries, with military chief dental officers, with leaders in organized dentistry and public health, with state oral health programs, and much more. Rear Adm. Ricks has served in the U.S. Public Health Service for over 22 years as a clinician (including being named Indian Health Service national clinical dentist of the year an unprecedented four times) and an administrator. Prior to this service, he was an associate dentist, independent contractor, and sole proprietor, and he also served as a military police officer in the Army National Guard. In addition to his role as USPHS Chief Dental Officer, he currently also serves in various roles in the Indian Health Service including Continuing Dental Education Coordinator (responsible for 300 courses each year), Expanded Function Dental Assistant Coordinator (oversees training and certification of hundreds of EFDAs), IHS National Oral Health Surveillance Coordinator, and National Oral Health Promotion/Disease Prevention Coordinator. He also an adjunct associate professor at Meharry Medical College School of Dentistry. Rear Adm. Ricks has received numerous accolades in his

career including the 2021 ADA Distinguished Service Award, the Global Summits Institute 2020 Global Leader of the Year Award, the U.S. Public Health Service Distinguished Service and Meritorious Service Medals, and over six dozen other international, national, USPHS, and agency awards and recognitions. He is a board-certified Diplomate of the American Board of Dental Public Health, a Santa Fe Senior Scholar, and a Fellow of the International College of Dentists and the American College of Dentists.


