New Business

Committee Reports

Notices Committee-Cheryl/Maricopa: We meet Saturday mornings at 9am. We are following up on notices and outreach we've done in the past, hoping to get the DeFacto to meet with us so we can share information about our Assembly.

Constitution Committee-Cheryl/Maricopa: Will be starting soon, and we will be calling out for people when we get ready to do that.

Meet n Greet Committee-Polly/Yavapai: She hasnt heard anything from Steve yet, and lost his number accidentally, but George/Yavapai has offered tlo help her with the Meet N Greet. Given the nature of this committee, it is decided that it will be ok for them to proceed with only two committee members.

Outreach Committee-Diane/Maricopa: Meets at 10:30am Saturdays. We have a good team, but are wondering about Bob/ Maricopa, he had asked to be on the committee, but has been MIA. If anyone has been in touch with him, please ask him if he's still interested in being on this committee. Deanie has submitted a first draft of a contact letter to send to various content creators on youtube and other video platforms, and websites to make ourselves known and to see if any of them would like to interview one of us or do a report or an article about us. Lou Anne has contacted Arizona Bike Week about getting a booth. It's \$1559.00 for a booth for the whole three day event. She is going to see if we can get them to lower the price for us since we're not selling anything.

Duncan has a new tactic for approaching people that we will eventually be bringing to the Assembly Lou Anne also wants to know what the Assembly thinks about opening a Twitter account. She would volunteer to set it up and monitor it. She would of coarse submit everything she wants to put up to the Assembly. She chose Twitter (X) because she has an account already and is familiar with their format. We will have the introduction letter to submit to content creators ready for the Assemblies approval at the next meeting.

Litigation Committee-Cheryl/Maricopa: We don't have a litigation committee at this time, so if anyone is interested in learning about common law, let us know and we'll get you dialed in and get that committee going again.

Banking Committe-Cheryl/Maricopa: Still on haitus until they hear from Global.

Coronors Committee-Nick/Maricopa: Nothing happening right now. They have uploaded Coronors documents to the website should anyone need to record a birth or a death, but thankfully there has been nothing for the Coronor to do. Diane/Maricopa interjects that recently we had a young couple who had a live home birth that had nothing to do with the State of State. She recorded live birth record for their daughter. How does the Coronor fit into that ? Nick/Maricopa: The Coronors Office functions similar to how the DeFacto Department of Vital Statistics would. They record births and deaths and establish a permanent record on each State National within the archives of the State. Diane?Maricopa asks about the people coming in and changing their status who have children who are under the age of 21, and that there should be some process of creating a record of life for them so it is very clear that they are on the land and soil even though they are not considered State Nationals until they turn 21 and do their own paper work. This was something Anna has brought up many times. Diane/Maricopa suggests that this is a subject that the Recording Secretaries, the Coronors Committee and the Assembly needs to address to come up with that process. All agree. Dennis/Coconino suggests that they record them on our website and send a copy to Nick/Maricopa for our Archives. There is more discussion on the topic between Miriam/Cochise, Nick/Maricopa, and Dennis/Coconino on ways to deal with the individual situations, depending on the parents wishes but that they can have a record of life recorded before they turn 21.

Militia-Dennis/Coconino: There is a militia meeting this Friday at 6:30pm on the free conference line. Dennis will send out a reminder email to everyone. The number is on the Agenda.

Website Committee-Diane/Maricopa: The website committee hasnt been meeting, there really isnt anything pressing at this time. They are still looking for someone to help them with the website who is familiar with Word Press who would be able to go in and add things, change things, delete things, etc. Not to post things like John does, but to make structural changes, building or rebuilding parts of the website.

Vetting Committee-Cheryl/Maricopa: Nothing to report at this time.

Jural Assembly-Cheryl/Maricopa: Can be called into action as needed.

Ombudsman Committee-Cheryl/Maricopa: We will be voting for George Musienga

for Ombudsman tonight. His bio has been attached to the Agenda. We will be voting on him when we get to new business. Everyone should have sent their vote in to their County Chair by email or to Dennis/Coconino if they don't have a County Chair.

Protocol Committee-Cheryl/Maricopa: We will be having a meeting this Wednesday at 6:30pm to try to finish the protocols, to make sure they are in alignment with Anna's articles so we can move forward on Arizona, and everyone knows what's expected of them as part of the Assembly.

Vender Research Committee-Polly/Yavapai: We are going to meet tomorrow, Wednesday at 5pm. She and Cheryl have done more research and have sent out a significant amount of paper work to look at. They have just scanned it because it's 620 pages. Everyone in the meeting got a copy of that and it was suggested that everyone scroll through it to see what the State of States are paying subcontractors for now so they can get an idea of what we're up against if it falls to us to take over funding and managing all those services.

Data Center Research-Diane/Maricopa: She has an idea on how to get more information on the data center, as there is a group that has formed which strongly opposes these data centers and she wants to get a hold of a woman she knows that is involved and take advantage of data they have compiled. Diane is having difficulty getting any information on data centers in Arizona, the State of State is keeping very tight lipped about data centers planned for Arizona. So she does not have a lot to report at this time, but she's got a lead on a possible source of info to check out. If anyone is interested in helping Diane with this research, please step up and let her know.

Sargeant at Arms-Duncan/Pinal: Has a comment regarding new tactics for outreach that Diane/Maricopa mentioned in the outreach committee report. The short version is whenever we come in contact with the bureaucrats, Federal or State Employee Union members, etc, at the first chance to bring up the subject of money, especially as many state employees are asking for higher wages to keep up with inflation and the higher cost of living, you should point out that they need to demand to be paid in asset backed currency, as both the Federal Corporate Service Provider and it's State of State subsidiaries are bankrupt, as they have none of their own assets and are printing money into existence based on the credit of the American working class who's lifetime earnings have been collateralized to back the debt of the Federal Government by the Federal Reserve Private Banking System. Most commercial banks are insolvent and when there is a banking collapse, they will seize most of the assets of their individual depositors who are considered unsecured creditors to pay the priority secured creditors, and eventually the Federal and State of State governments will default on their financial obligations to their employees pension funds, contractors, etc. Then you explain to them about Global Family Bank established to serve Land and Soil jurisdiction living people

with honest real banking for living people with our established, gold backed American Federation Dollars, and prepaid credit owed to Americans for the confiscation of our gold. That Global Family Group has established it's own separate transfer system to transact internationally in the Land and Soil Jurisdiction, and the benefit to all Americans of Status Correction. He goes on to make a comparison between Fractional Reserve Banking and the recent Silver Paper futures shorts and the obvious manipulation taking place. Duncan suggests reading Anna's articles "The Federal Reserve" and the "Shennanigans" articles for better understanding. He also reports on new Banking rules regarding tracking and reporting withdrawals of a much lower threshold.

Dennis/Coconino: Reports Banking News from Anna's last call regarding court rulings prompted by the paper silver shorts fiasco. And what failing Banks can do to save themselves if they are willing to reform themselves and practice lawfull banking and that they can contact Global Family Bank and can be absorbed into GFB's system and keep their doors open. Cheryl/Maricopa asks questions about the ramifications of GFB's willingness to absorbing banks that are being closed if they were willing to do honest banking with lawfull money on the timing of us getting our funding, as a time window of a week was mentioned in regards to getting those other Banks set up properly and their doors open within a week. Dennis thinks that it is probably a good indication that funding for our Banks is imminent.

Jeff/Yavapai: suggests Anna's Article #5746 titled Granna Bytes, "Volatility" that goes into detail on the court rulings Anna talked about in her last call that Dennis/Coconino just refered to.

Diane/Maricopa: Brings up the topic of sharing forms or other resources developed by our or other Assemblies with other States to help them move forward and save them the work of doing all their own official paper work or education packets, etc so that we all can help each other progress faster towards our goals. She says she was contacted by Wisconsin about some forms we had developed that someone on Arizona sent to them as examples. That person asked if we would be willing to share those forms with them to use as a template. Diane replied that she would ask the Assembly on their behalf. She is asking if any of us would be opposed to that. Dennis/Cocnino asks which forms she is refering to. She states they were forms that would've been equivalent to the DeFacto's Power of Attorney, we called it a Designated Representative form, the DNR form, basically we made a facsimile for all the DeFacto medical forms for End of Life care, other medical or mental health care instructions in case of the patient being incapacitated. Dennis/Mariocopa asks for input from the Assembly.

Cheryl/Maricopopa approves and is all in for helping other Assemblies.

George/Musienga: His brother is a member of the Wisconsin Assembly and his coordinator thought it was great if they could use those for Templates since they are

also under staffed to save them time. Deanie/Pinal, Nick/Maricopa, Miriam/Cochise agree, Polly/Yavapai complements compliments Diane/Maricopa on her work creating those forms as she also helped, and agrees as well. Diane tells us they will be editable documents that Wisconsin will have to customize to their needs. Nick/Maricopa tells Diane/Maricopa that he would like to be involved in the review of the documents if they start the Form's committee back up again. Dennis/coconino asks if there is anyone else interested in participating in rebooting that committee. Polly/Yavapai, Lou Anne/Maricopa and Jeannette/Maricopa express interest. Dennis/Coconino asks for an "all in favor" poll on sharing the documents, and we all are (in favor).

International Business Assembly-Cheryl/Maricopa: They continue to meet twice a month to discuss a wide variety of topics. They've got ongoing education. There is a group that teaches people how to bring their businesses onto the Land, a group working on right to travel, the International Treasury Think Tank, The Vender Committee to review the expenditures of the DeFacto State and what they are contracting out to who for how much, and where cuts in spending can be made when we take over providing those services. Marc Silliman is on the latter two. There is more discussion on how to find help and information to assist Jeanette/Maricopa in moving her business onto the Land and also some discussion on whether or not the 928's were still required to correct your Status. The point is made that each State has its own requirements for being an Assembly member or holding office. 928's are required to be a member of the International Business Assembly, and Arizona does require them to hold office in the State.
