Dear Colleagues:

As fellow physicians, we are committed to helping you navigate the resources available during the COVID-19 pandemic. **This brief message is intended to clarify your options regarding the COVID-19 vaccine.**

This message may be most helpful for members of our independent practices, and does not supersede or replace advice provided by the State of Delaware, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, or the Delaware health system you may be affiliated with.

Physicians employed by health systems should consult with their leader/Department chair for details on the COVID-19 vaccination plan. Independent physicians/providers who want to be vaccinated should contact and inquire with the medical-dental staff office of the hospital/health system where they have privileges or are on staff.

Independent practices should also enroll their practices to get set up to receive the vaccine. This allows you to (a) request a small number of vaccine for just you and your office staff; and/or (b) request a more substantial number for your patients.
